Secular & Religious Holidays or celebrations in December 2018 and January 2019

CHRISTMAS DAY: 25TH DECEMBER

Christmas is an annual commemoration of the birth of Jesus Christ and a widely

observed holiday, generally celebrated on December 25 by millions of people around the world. It is celebrated by special church services, exchange of gifts, special meals and decoration of the home. Christmas is a civil holiday in many of the world's nations, is celebrated by an increasing number of non-Christians, and is an integral part of the Christmas and holiday season. HANUKKAH: 3RD – 10TH DECEMBER Hanukkah (Chanukah) commemorates the recapture and rededication by the Jewish people of the Jerusalem



COUNCIL REJECTS KINGSWOOD PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT PROPOSAL

Kingston Council has voted to abandon the Planning Scheme Amendment process to rezone Kingswood Golf Course.

Councillors voted unanimously to abandon the process at a Special Council Meeting held recently.

Kingston Mayor Cr Steve Staikos said that the decision comes following a six-week public consultation period which attracted 8,000 public submissions (more than 7,000 individual), the largest number ever received by Council for a Planning proposal.

"The overwhelming majority of submissions opposed the proposed rezoning and construction of hundreds of homes on the former golf course. Councillors want the community to know that we have read their submissions and we have heard them," Cr Staikos said.

Tonight's Special Council Meeting was keenly watched by community



members, who viewed the live stream online or filled the public gallery in the Council Chambers. "Kingston is proud to be fully transparent and accessible. We live-stream every Council Meeting on the internet for the community to access," said Cr Staikos.

The private owner of the Kingswood Peninsula Golf Course site, at Centre Dandenong Road Dingley Village, had lodged an application with Kingston Council to:

- rezone the site from part Special Use Zone (Golf Courses) and part General Residential Zone (Schedule 3) to a General Residential Zone (Schedule 2) to allow for redevelopment of the site for residential purposes.
- subdivide the land into 514 lots including 6 superlots and approval for buildings and works on lots less than 300 square metres.
- apply a new Development Plan Overlay (Schedule 8) to the site to guide the future use and development of the land.
- apply a Vegetation Protection Overlay, Environmental Significance Overlay and Significant Landscape Overlay to protect significant vegetation on the site.
- apply Environmental Significance Overlays to address potential impact of ground water contamination and landfill gas migration.

WESTALL EXTENSION URGENTLY NEEDED TO PREVENT TRAFFIC CRISIS IN MELBOURNE'S SOUTH-EAST

Kingston, Glen Eira and Monash Councils have joined forces to call on the Victorian Government to urgently invest in an extension of Westall Road to avert a traffic crisis in the region when the new Mordialloc Freeway is constructed.

The three councils, representing close to 350,000 residents in Melbourne's south-east, have warned that the new

The Mayors of Glen Eira, Kingston and Monash last week joined together to call for an urgent commitment from the Victorian Government to extend Westall Road to link the Dingley Bypass/new Mordialloc Freeway with the Monash Freeway.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said he welcomed the construction of the Mordialloc Freeway and hoped action could also be taken to prevent it causing local traffic issues. "The region has already experienced increased traffic volumes since the opening of the Dingley Bypass in 2016 with thousands of extra cars now travelling along South Road each day and motorists directed onto roads which were not designed for today's traffic volumes," Cr Staikos said.

"On behalf of our communities we are asking the Victorian Government to urgently commit to extending Westall Road to prevent major problems when the Mordialloc Freeway is built."

The Westall Extension project is also supported by South East Melbourne SEM Group, which represents communities, business leaders and Casey, Frankston, Greater Dandenong, Casey, Cardinia, Mornington Peninsula, Monash, Glen Eira and Kingston Councils.

KINGSTON DECLARED A 'TERMITE-PRONE' AREA

Kingston has been declared a 'termiteprone' area, with extra protection now required on new homes.

Kingston Councillors voted to declare Kingston a termite prone area, at the Monday 22 October Ordinary Council meeting.

Mayor Steve Staikos said that this decision, which comes into effect on 1 January 2019, aims to increase community awareness about the risks of termites at properties and to increase measures to prevent them.

"CSIRO reports have revealed that termites are prevalent across Victoria. Being declared a termite prone area will ensure that developers put in measures to protect new properties against infestations," said Cr Staikos.

Of the 31 Melbourne Councils, 15 are designated as termite areas, including neighbouring Councils Frankston, Monash and Glen Eira.

According to Archicentre Australia, some of the warning signs of termites to look out for include:

- discarded wings from swarmers.
- bubbling paint.
- strange bits of mud in plasterwork, or
- disintegrating wood.

"Homeowners with existing properties who have any concerns, are encouraged to invite an expert to their property to assess their risk," said Cr Staikos.

We will take time to consider our options, however we don't plan to resubmit our proposal in its current form, or in the near future."

DVCA has written to the Australian Super requesting a meeting to press our



case for the future of Kingswood GC to be Public Open Space, with a number of options available to them, to lead to this result. WE WILL NOT be accepting just a reduced residential plan for Kingswood and Dingley Village.

CHAIN OF PARKS - SANDBELT PARKLANDS

DVCA is pleased to receive the progress report from our Mayor Cr. Staikos for the Kingston Green Wedge, "The End of Landfill in Kingston's Green Wedge".

Background

The "Chain of Parks" for Kingston was first proposed back in the 1970s, as a means of providing open space in a series of connected parks on land used for sand mining and subsequent landfill in Kingston.

In May 1994, a Sandbelt Open Space Project Development Plan was formally prepared by Melbourne Parks and Waterways (Parks Victoria) for this. The plan proposed a centrally linked park spine stretching from Warrigal Rd Moorabbin to Braeside Park in Dingley Village, with the parks to be connected by pedestrian and bike paths and trails.

The Project's key theme to be golf, reflecting the international reputation of the region's Sandbelt golf courses.

Fast forward to 2006 and Kingston Council prepared a Sandbelt Open Project Policy to implement the Melbourne Water 1994 Plan for land designated for the "Chain of Parks" in the Kingston Green Wedge.

Forward again to 2018, and now, after so many years of tip smells and dust from the adjacent sand mine landfill sites, it is terrific to see the "Chain of Parks" concept really starting to be established as the landfills cease to operate and then are progressively rehabilitated as open space.

With the rapid growth of Melbourne in both size and population, the Kingston Green Wedge "Chain of Parks" will be an extremely valuable and vital open space in SE Melbourne to help provide for passive and active recreation current and future needs.

December in Australia means the start of summer holidays for many, end of the year functions, shopping, Christmas Day spent with family, food and more food, New Year celebrations and more.

Twelve Safety Tips to stay healthy, safe and happy over the festive season:

1. Lights & Decorations: Be careful when putting up lights and decorations, falls from ladders, tables and other raised services are more prevalent during Christmas. Also check lights and other electrical decorations, many fires are triggered by some failure or malfunction in electrical decorations and Christmas lights that are faulty or incorrectly installed.

2. Alcohol: Drink responsibly and you'll avoid a whole host of complications that overindulgence can cause, including family arguments, falls and car accidents.

3. Driving: Australia's road toll invariably spikes during the Christmas and New Year holidays, when traffic volumes increase dramatically and people travel longer distances on unfamiliar roads. Drive safely and don't drink and drive or drive whilst fatigued.

4. Shopping: Never carry large amounts of cash and at ATMs only take out as much money as you need. Cover your pin number and call the police if you believe the machine has been compromised. Do

not leave your shopping bags in the car, as it can become a soft target for thieves. If shopping online, be sure that the site and payment method you're using is secure and that the online business is reputable. You can do a google search of 'business name + complaints'

5. Food safety: what would the holidays be without food, but no one wants food poisoning. Take extra care to make sure food is properly refrigerated and remember to separate potentially hazardous foods from cooked or ready-to-eat foods. If you know – or even suspect – that food may have been left out unrefrigerated for four hours or more, it's better to throw it away than risk getting sick. When in doubt, chuck it out!

6. Night out: Tell someone where you are going and when you will be back. Plan how you will go and return and if you change your plans when out, let them know. Keep to locations where other people are and if using your car, park in secure well-lit places. Take care when carrying your handbag, smart- phone or tablet in crowded areas. Keep them in a safe location, within view. Keep handbags zipped and don't put your wallet in your back pocket. Where possible go out with a friend or group.

7. Heat: Slip slop slap when outside in the sun and on days of high heat, remember to stay in the shade or cool places, keep your fluids up and check regularly on the wellbeing of babies and older people who

can quickly be effected by high stress. Don't forget your pets who can also suffer in the heat.

8. Fire: Be aware of Bushfires alerts, especially when travelling in rural areas. In days of high fire risk have a plan of what to do in case of fires in the area.

9. Swimming: do not swim alone or under the effects of alcohol or drugs. If swimming at the beach choose a patrolled beaches and remember to swim between the flags. Do not swim or dive into unfamiliar water, used designated swimming locations where possible.

10.Home: Secure all doors and windows of your home and use your alarm when the house is vacant and when home at night. If you're going away for Christmas, make your home look occupied, leave a light on and get a trusted neighbour to check on your property.

11. Pets: A busy house full of guests and noise can be very stressful for animals, and all those tempting decorations and foods can pose significant risks. Christmas food and alcohol are among some of the most dangerous for animals to consume, so resist that pleading face. Christmas decorations look like toys and pose a threat if chewed, ingested or played with. Many pets will struggle with the sounds of fireworks, an additional risk is that animals may flee to escape the noise, and become lost.

KINGSWOOD DEVELOPMENT PLANS NOW ON HOLD

Developers of the Kingswood golf course at Dingley Village have put all plans on hold following Kingston Council's decision to abandon seeking an amendment to the planning scheme to re-zone the site.

Councillors voted unanimously to abandon the process at a Special Council Meeting held on 17 October.

Spokesperson for the Kingswood development project team, Anna Martiniello, said the decision was disappointing, but not unexpected.

"We accept the decision of Kingston Council and understand that the project, in its current form, cannot proceed," Ms Martiniello said. "We will take time to consider our options, however we don't plan to re-submit our proposal in its current form, or in the near future."

Ms Martiniello said the site's owner, ASRP1 (a wholly-owned subsidiary of AustralianSuper), would determine how the project team would proceed, although both the owner and project team genuinely wish to pursue a constructive relationship with Council and with the local community and its representatives.

ASRP1 takes possession of the 54-hectare Kingswood site on 31 January, at which time the gates will be closed and locked. The Peninsula Kingswood Country Golf Club will cease its operations earlier on 1 December 2018.

"We are not golf course operators so the site will be locked for safety reasons," Ms Martiniello said.

Politics

It's possible the next application may be politically-assisted, but at the time of writing, both the Premier, Daniel Andrews and Matthew Guy have not responded to our multiple requests for comment. All our local politicians have made supportive statements, but they will not be the decision-makers. If they bypass Council, VCAT is not involved; rezoning is a decision for the Minister or a panel.

Planning Minister

The Planning Minister Wynne said: "The Minister has always encouraged councils to make decisions in line with the expectations of their local communities. The developer has issued a statement saying they accept the decision and do not plan to

resubmit their proposal. As a result, there is nothing before the Minister to consider. Should any type of proposal be put forward in the future, it will need to be considered on its merits at that time." While the above is somewhat encouraging, it relies on (a) The Minister being re-elected, (b) keeping his portfolio and (c) political influences.

New Mayor

On November 15th, the new Mayor Georgina Oxley was elected and Kevin Poulter was there to congratulate her and had a brief chat about Save Kingswood. We will advise all councillors of new developments and strategies, so their Golf Course policy is not ignored by government.

Celebration

The recent Save Kingswood celebration at the Maker's Market was well attended, including by politicians and candidates.

The near future

Unless the owners want the Golf Course on display for potential buyers, the course will have long grass. They said they are not Golf Course operators and will be locking the gates "for safety reasons". It's likely they will only cut the grass when required by council for fire control. From time to time it may need residents to remind council that the park is in need of a clean up. The rule is, anything over 10cm (4 inches) must be mowed. Please let us know if (a) the grass exceeds that length or (b) anything undesirable is going on, like cutting down trees. Please also send any interesting photographs, like floods or wildlife. FAMILY VIOLENCE INTERVENTION ORDERS (IVO'S)

WHAT IS FAMILY VIOLENCE?

Family Violence is behaviour between family members that causes fear to an affected family member or members. The definition of Family Violence is broad and not only includes physical or sexual violence and also includes any behaviour that is used to control, threaten, force or dominate a family member through the use of fear. Therefore, emotional and financial abuse or dominance will also be considered an action of family violence.

The fear that an affected family member experiences need not necessarily be fear to themselves, rather, it can include fear for their property, another person or domestic pet. It is also important to note that a child who sees, hears or is in any way affected by family violence, will also be covered by the law.

What is a Family Violence Intervention Order?

A Family Violence Intervention Order (IVO) is a court order that protects an affected family member or members against family violence from a family member. The perpetrator of family violence will be known on the order as the Respondent.

An IVO includes conditions which prohibit the Respondent from using family violence against the affected family member and most commonly includes an order that the Respondent cannot go within a certain distance of the Affected Family Member (or members), and can lead to the Respondents removal from the family home.

If the Respondent breaks any conditions that are outlined on the IVO, the police can charge the Respondent with a criminal offence meaning the Respondent may end up having a criminal record.

DINGLEY BICYCLE REPAIRS 30 years experience Reasonable rates Pick up and delivery Call Vaughan on 9551 1875 If you are charged with contravening an IVO you should seek immediate legal advice as this is considered a very serious offence and should therefore be dealt with appropriate legal advice.

An IVO can also significantly affect arrangements regarding the care any children and the Respondent's time spent with the children, particularly if they are named on the order as affected family members. If you are a Respondent on such an order, and, as such are being prohibited from spending time with your children, you should seek immediate family law advice.

How to seek an IVO

An affected family member can seek an intervention order in two ways;:

- 1. By applying to the magistrates court; or
- 2. The police may make an application for IVO if they believe an affected family member is in danger.

If an IVO is made against you

Once an application has been made against you, the police will serve on you a copy of the application detailing the allegations made against you and a summons to appear in Court on a scheduled date. It is also likely the the affected family will have been issued with an interim order for their protection. If an interim order has been made you must ensure you follow the conditions even if you plan on defending the order.

You will need to attend court on the date that is listed on the summons, if you do not then the order will proceed undefended and a full IVO will likely be made against you.

As the Respondent there are a number of options for dealing with an IVO;

- 1. Consent to the IVO being made against you without admission;
- 2. Agree to an undertaking not to commit family violence, rather than an order (this will need to be consented to by both parties and the Magistrate); or
- 3. Defend the IVO.

If you choose to consent to the IVO you may also be in a position to negotiate terms such as the removal of the children's names from the order, or access to the property to remove your belongings. Agreeing to an IVO does not give you a criminal record, however, as detailed above if you breach any conditions of the IVO you may be charged with a criminal offence.

If you choose to defend the order the matter will be adjourned and listed for a final hearing at a further date. Prior to the final hearing you must ensure you gather relevant evidence to support your defence and character witnesses to assist with your character determination.

If you are experiencing family violence or you have been issued with a summons for an IVO, we suggest you seek legal advice to further discuss your options.

Christmas is here. Again. If you're like me and are still convinced we were only just celebrating Christmas 2017 two weeks ago, then you know it can be an incredibly stressful time of the year.

Mindfulness has a lot of attention in mainstream media recently, particularly with the development of adult colouring books and meditation; both of which have been shown to reduce levels of stress and anxiety in people, by encouraging them to focus their attention to whatever is happening in the present moment.

A recent study published by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) has found that intraocular pressure (IOP) in patients with glaucoma could be reduced by incorporating the practice of meditation into their daily routine. Glaucoma currently affects 300,000 Australians, and generally progresses without symptoms until the later stages of the condition (it affects your peripheral vision first, slowly reducing it until you are left with tunnel vision- central vision only); which is why regular eye checks play a vital role in the early detection of the disease. Currently, the only available treatment for glaucoma is lowering IOP with eye drops or surgery.

However, data from the AIIMS study found that there was benefit in the group of glaucoma patients who were managing their glaucoma with eye drops, meditation and breathing exercises for 1 hour a day for 21 days. Intraocular pressure in this group reduced by 6mmHg on average (a significant amount), compared to the group who were only taking eye drops. Not only

did the meditation group have lower IOP's, they also reported an overall increase in their mood and well-being. It is a promising area of research that will undoubtedly raise the importance of not only treating an eye disease but also a person's general health and mental well-being too.

So, this Christmas, if you find yourself getting overwhelmed by relatives overstaying their welcome; take a few moments to breathe. Not only will you help your sanity, but you'll be on your way to protecting your eyes.







