There has been a lot of talk about a referendum to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the Constitution

The Australian Constitution came into effect on 1 January 1901, having been passed as a British Act of Parliament and given royal assent by Queen Victoria in 1900. It united the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania and later, Western Australia as a federation known as the Commonwealth of Australia. As well as being a set of laws, a Constitution reflects a nation's values, its idea of itself.

The Australian Constitution demarcates the powers and roles of each of our three branches of governance; the Parliament, the Executive and the Courts and was intended to unite Australia under the original and continuing agreement of the Australian people, but the first peoples of Australia were not included in this agreement. When the Australian Constitution was being drafted Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, along with women and members of ethnic communities were excluded from the discussions.

Many Australians don't know that our Constitution still permits racial discrimination in Sections 25 and 51. This makes Australia the only country with a Constitution that allows for discrimination against its Indigenous peoples based on their race.

In January 2012 an Expert Panel which included Indigenous and community leaders, constitutional experts and parliamentarians – reported to the government after it had consulted extensively across the nation. It recommended that Australians should vote in a referendum to:

- Remove Section 25 which says the States can ban people from voting based on their race.
- Remove section 51(xxvi) which can be used to pass laws that discriminate against people based on their race.

- Insert a new section 51A to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and to preserve the Australian Government's ability to pass laws for the benefit of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
- Insert a new section 116A, banning racial discrimination by government.
- Insert a new section 127A, recognising Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages were this country's first tongues, while confirming that English is Australia's national language.

The Australian Constitution can only be changed by referendum. A referendum is a vote by Australians over the age of 18 on a specific change to the text of the Australian Constitution. For a proposed change to be accepted a national majority of voters in a majority of states must vote 'yes'.

There have been 44 referendums held since 1901 and only eight of these have been successful. The most successful referendum in Australia's history was in 1967 where 90.77% of the nation voted 'Yes for Aborigines' The 1967 referendum amended the Australian Constitution to give the federal parliament the power to make laws in relation to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and to allow for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to be included in the census.

When people talk about recognising Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians in our Constitution there are usually two main areas they're talking about changing. The first is changing the wording in the preamble. A preamble is a statement that introduces a constitution but has no legal power. Changing the preamble to acknowledge Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians would be an important statement about the place and value of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as the original inhabitants – the first people – of Australia.

The second possible change that people talk about is changing or adding to the main part of the Constitution where the laws are set out, which would have legal significance.

For example, if a non-discrimination clause was included in the body of the Constitution, a government would no longer be able to make laws which discriminate against Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

Acknowledging Indigenous Australians in the preamble in a way that recognised and valued their special place as the first Australians would not give them more rights than other Australians. Changing the body of the Constitution to include equality and protection from discrimination would give all Australians the benefit of better rights protections.

Over the coming years the proposed referendum will generate much public consultation and discussion

There is often greater support and strength for a referendum proposal that is championed by the people. This can be achieved through comprehensive debate and opportunities for public involvement. It is important that any referendum is not perceived as owned either by politicians or the elite, but by the nation as a whole. Past referendums have demonstrated that greater understanding among the Australian public of the issues being proposed increases the chances of a yes vote.

Bipartisan political support is also essential for the successful passage of any referendum. Currently there is bipartisan support for the recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the Australian Constitution.

# Don't get caught out paying fake tax debts

## **BEWARE TAX SCAMS**

This time of year sees the increase in emails, SMS or phone calls allegedly from the Australia Taxation Office (ATO). The ATO has received 40,225 reports of impersonation scams so far in 2019 with just over \$1 million in losses. Cyber criminals use sophisticated technology to impersonate legitimate tax office phone numbers, email addresses etc.

The ATO warns that taxpayers should be wary of any unexpected phone call, text message or email claiming to be from the tax office. While they may contact you in these ways, if it doesn't seem right, independently find our phone number and check if the contact was legitimate. If you receive a pre-recorded message claiming to be from us either hang up or simply delete the voicemail.

While the ATO regularly contacts taxpayers by phone, email and SMS, there are some tell-tale signs that it isn't the ATO. The ATO will not:

- send you an email or SMS asking you to click on a link directing you to a login page
- use aggressive or rude behaviour, or threaten you with immediate arrest, jail or deportation
- request payment of a debt via iTunes or Google Play cards, pre-paid Visa cards, cryptocurrency or direct credit to a personal bank account
- request a fee in order to release a refund owed to you.

Current estimates show that Melbourne will grow to 7.9 million people by 2051. Melbourne can't keep sprawling outwards, so we're facing the challenge of how to accommodate more people without losing the character and amenity of our neighbourhoods. Kingston Council has long-planned for population growth to be centred around our key activity centres, close to public transport, shops and services. This has allowed us to protect the neighbourhood character and amenity of our quieter residential streets.

To address these challenges, Council is undertaking a Housing Strategy and Neighbourhood Character Study with consulting firm, Ethos Urban. The Housing Strategy component is a twenty-year plan to manage housing growth and change across all residential areas in Kingston. This strategy also provides a basis to review residential zones across the municipality. We need to undertake this work as we currently have interim zones in place. The new residential zones need to be implemented before the interim zones expire.

The Neighbourhood Character Study involves a detailed assessment of neighbourhood character in Kingston's residential areas and the creation of design guidelines to influence what new development should look like.

Council has been working collaboratively with our community to develop a first draft of both the Housing Strategy and Neighbourhood Character Study. Kingston Council has held Ward Meetings, community meetings, online and hard-copy surveys, listening posts, guided and self-guided walking tours and established a Community Panel – representing a wide cross-section of Kingston residents.

We'd like your feedback on the draft Housing Strategy and Neighbourhood Character Study.

As Councillors, we ourselves still have some queries about the proposed draft, such as the removal of two protections that General Residential Zone 3 residents currently enjoy under our local planning policy – average lot size subdivisions limited to two dwellings and double storey developments encouraged to the frontage (discourage two storey in the backyard), so we're keen to hear community feedback before anything is finalised.

## COMMUNITY GIVES FEEDBACK ON COUNCIL SERVICES

Residents have given Kingston Council positive results in the annual independent Community Satisfaction Survey, with strong improvement across a number of service areas.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley welcomed Council's consistent overall performance score of 64, above the state-wide council average of 60. "Kingston strives to deliver great services, value for money and the survey shows people appreciate this with our overall score remaining stable and above the state average," Cr Oxley said.

Four hundred randomly selected Kingston residents took part in the annual survey - coordinated by the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning and conducted by independent group JWS Research in February this year.

Kingston's strongest performing areas were appearance of public areas (score of 76), our recreational facilities (score of 74) and Kingston's Art Centres & Libraries (73).

"The areas we showed most improvement in were the appearance of public areas, planning and building permits, Council's general town planning policy and decisions made in the interest of the community – with all these areas jumping 3-4 points since last year's survey which was great to see," Cr Oxley said.

Cr Oxley said 74% of residents believe Council is heading in the right direction – up from 66% last year. "When compared to the previous year, over 60% of service area scores have either improved or remained stable. While there's plenty to celebrate, we are also keen to hear from the community about areas for ongoing improvement."

The areas identified by the community as being of most importance and needing improvement were planning for population growth, parking facilities and decisions made in the interest of the community.

The results also recorded a drop in the areas of waste management, environmental sustainability plus community & cultural activities.

"In light of the recycling crisis facing Australia and concerns about Melbourne's increasing population these results are not surprising," Cr Oxley said.

"Kingston is responding at a local level and has already planned major improvements in our waste management with \$1.5 million set aside in our budget to introduce a Food and Organics recycling service. Council is also consulting the community on a draft Neighbourhood Character Strategy and Housing Strategy to help guide development in local suburbs."

## National Scams Awareness Week 2019: 12-16 August

Every year, scams cost Australians, businesses and the economy hundreds of millions of dollars and cause emotional harm to victims and their families.

Everyone is vulnerable to scams so everyone needs information about how to identify and avoid being scammed. Some people think that only the gullible and greedy fall victim to scams. The truth is scammers are clever and if you don't know what to look out for, anyone can fall victim to a scam.

Have you received an offer that seems too good to be true, perhaps a phone call to help fix your computer or a threat to pay money you do not owe, an alert from your bank or telecommunications provider about a problem with your account or even an invitation to 'befriend' or connect online?

Scammers know how to press your buttons to get what they want. They are getting smarter, moving with the times to take advantage of new technology, new products or services and major events to create believable stories that will convince you to part with your money or personal details.

The best way to protect yourself is through awareness and education. Be alert to the fact that scams exist.

When dealing with uninvited contacts from people or businesses, whether it's over the phone, by mail, email, in person or on a social networking site, always consider the possibility that the approach may be a scam.

## *Remember, if it looks too good to be true, it probably is.*

### Know who you're dealing with.

If you've only ever met someone online or are unsure of the legitimacy of a business, take some time to do a bit more research. Do a Google image search on photos or search the internet for others who may have had dealings with them.

## Do not open suspicious texts, pop-up

windows or emails—delete them. If unsure, verify the identity of the contact through an independent source such as a phone book or online search. Don't use the contact details provided in the message sent to you.

### Keep your personal details secure.

Put a lock on your mailbox and shred your bills and other important documents before throwing them out. Keep your passwords and pin numbers in a safe place. Be very careful about how much personal information you share on social media sites. Scammers can use your information and pictures to create a fake identity or to target you with a scam.

## Beware of unusual payment methods.

Scammers often ask for payment by wire transfers, preloaded cards and even Google Play, Steam, or iTunes cards and Bitcoin. These are nearly always a sign that it is part of a scam.

## Keep your mobile devices and computers secure.

Always use password protection, don't share access with others (including remotely), update security software and back up content. Protect your WiFi network with a password and avoid using



public computers or WiFi hotspots to access online banking or provide personal information.

## Choose your passwords carefully.

Choose passwords that would be difficult for others to guess and update them regularly. A strong password should include a mix of upper and lower case letters, numbers and symbols. Don't use the same password for every account/ profile, and don't share your passwords with anyone.



## Beware of any requests for your details or money.

Never send money or give credit card numbers, online account details or copies of personal documents to anyone you don't know or trust. Don't agree to transfer money or goods for someone else: money laundering is a criminal offence.

## Be careful when shopping online.

Beware of offers that seem too good to be true, and always use an online shopping service that you know and trust. Think twice before using virtual currencies (like Bitcoin)—they do not have the same protections as other transaction methods, which means you can't get your money back once you send it.

This information comes from the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC), the national consumer protection agencies, The Little Black Book of Scams.

The Little Black Book of Scams is recognised internationally as an important tool for consumers and small businesses to learn about scams including:

- the most common scams to watch out for
- the different ways scammers can contact you
- the tools scammers use to trick you
- the warning signs
- how to protect yourself, and
- where you can find help.

## WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO RETIRE?

There has been much social and political debate since the federal government proposed pushing out the age at which Australians can access the age pension. Although most occupations don't have a legislated retirement date, there is little doubt that our tax and social security systems do have a significant impact on when many of us retire and how we plan to do it.

### Here are a few examples:

• I'll retire when I can get the age pension

For some people this will be a necessity. They can't afford to retire unless the pension is there to support them. Access to the age pension depends on your date of birth. Since 1 July 2017, the qualifying age for the age pension for men and women is 65½ years. It rises by six months every two years until it reaches 67 by 1 July 2023. The government is keen to see the pension age increase to 70 by 2035 but that has become a political football.

If your retirement doesn't line up exactly with the relevant pension age, there may be some good alternatives to consider. If you leave work earlier, would you consider drawing on your retirement savings for a year or two before the pension begins? Alternatively, working for a couple of years past pension age could qualify you for the Work Bonus which financially rewards age pensioners who wish to continue working.

## • I'll stop work when I can get my hands on my superannuation

Generally, unless you die, become disabled or suffer financial hardship, the earliest time you can draw on your super is when you reach the so-called 'preservation age'. Again, this is different for people of different birth years: 55 if you were born before mid-1960 and rising gradually to 60 for those born after July 1964. There are also political rumblings that the preservation age could be increased.

There could be other options you may want to consider, such as drawing on non-super savings if you retire earlier, but careful weighing up the pros and cons of this beforehand is crucial.

## • I will wait until my super is tax-free

Waiting until after you reach 60 to access your super tax-free is a good option if you're ready to retire at what is, these days, a relatively young age. The downside of retiring "early" at 60 is that your retirement savings must last the distance and given that Australians are living longer, this could be at least another two decades. However, with good advice, there can be many opportunities to structure a suitable tax-effective retirement plan no matter when you plan to leave the workforce.

The decision of when to call it quits can be a difficult one emotionally and financially. Your licensed financial adviser can assist in ensuring that the date you choose puts you in an optimal financial position.

## TIME LIMITS ON INITIATING PROPERTY PROCEEDINGS

Under the Family Law Act 1975, there are strict timeframes determining how long you have to reach a formal property settlement where your relationship has ended. If you fall outside these deadlines, it may be too late to initiate property proceedings or execute a Binding Financial Agreement. Please note there is no time frame on initiating proceedings in parenting disputes.

## **De Facto Separation**

After a de facto separation, you and your partner have precisely two years from the date of separation to formalise your agreement.

The date of separation is not necessarily calculated from the date you stop residing in the same premises. This is because it is possible to live separately under the same roof, and still be separated. Where you are in this situation, the court will consider a number of factors to determine whether or not you were in a relationship. These factors include the following:

• Whether you kept your finances separate;



- The nature of the household;
- The social aspects of your relationship;
- Whether you have a sexual relationship; and
- The nature of the commitment between the parties.

These factors enable the court to make a considered decision if there is a dispute as to when the separation occurred.

### Divorce

Once you and your husband or wife get a divorce, you have only one year to reach a formal agreement from the date of the divorce. The reason for this shorter time frame is that prior to divorcing, you and your former spouse must have been separated for exactly one year prior to making an application to the courts for a divorce. During this year, you may reach a formal agreement and therefore after you divorce, you are only allowed one year to finalise your property settlement.

The length of separation prior to divorcing will not affect the one year time period you have to initiate proceedings. You can be separated for many years before divorcing and you will still have the additional one year after you divorce to reach a formal agreement.

### **Out of Time Applications**

If you do not initiate proceedings within the legislated timeframes, you may make an out of time application to the courts for the courts 'leave' to file proceedings. The courts will allow your application if you can demonstrate that you will suffer hardship if leave is not granted. This hardship must be something more than loss and you must be able to demonstrate that your case is worth pursuing.

Your case is worth pursuing if you have a genuine chance of being successful. Finally, you must also be able to provide a valid reason that demonstrates why you did not initiate proceedings prior to the expiration of the allotted timeframe.

The courts powers in this regard are discretionary meaning they do not have to accept your application. Therefore, such applications can be a costly with the possibility that you will not receive the orders sought.

If the court rejects your out of time application, you can appeal the decision. You have 28 days to make this appeal, and to do so you must file a Notice to Appeal and provide a copy of the order with the court. You will also be required to pay a filing fee.

If you are ever experience a breakdown of a de facto relationship or marriage, you should seek legal advice as soon as possible to ensure any agreement you reach is binding under the Family Law Act.

## RECYCLE YOUR USED CONTACT LENSES, BLISTER PACKS AND CASES

When you hear a discussion in the media about single use plastics, your mind may drift to this time last year when Coles and Woolworths removed the use of single use grocery bags in favour of biodegradable, re-useable bags. Other single use plastics like straws, are getting a lot of attention as well due to the amount of them ending up in landfill, taking years to break down and causing damage to our environment.

Contact lenses, though a medical device, are also single use plastics. In the USA, an Arizona State University (ASU) Study found that almost 10 tonnes of contact lenses end up in wastewater systems annually. The different types of plastic materials that make up a majority of the disposable contact lenses on the international market, do break down physically, but only to smaller plastic particles, which leads to "microplastic" development. These microplastics enter ecosystems above and underwater, and are likely to have a negative impact on the plants and animals that reside there.

A big concern is the impact these microplastics can have on marine life and

humans indirectly. If an animal ingests microplastics, and are a part of the food chain, these can ultimately find their way into the human food supply.

In a move by Bausch + Lomb that began in 2017, contact lens wearers now have the option of participating in a free recycling program. In conjunction with recycling company TerraCycle, any brand of used contact lenses, blister packs and contact lens cases can be shipped to undergo recycling. TerraCycle breaks down, washes and melts the waste into raw plastic materials into new products, such as park benches.

## KINGSWOOD PRIMARY SCHOOL



FOUNDATION FOR SUCCESS

We finished off our last week of Term 2 by

participating in different activities in acknowledgement of our indigenous cultures. The Djirri Djirri Dance Group came to visit Kingswood and present to the students in Years 3 and 4 (see picture below). The teachers were impressed with how engaged the students were in the presentation; the students loved learning new dances and the group congratulated Kingswood on the level of knowledge and awareness of indigenous cultures that exists within our school community. On Tuesday we had Boomerang decoration at lunchtime.

All students were invited to join in and demonstrated their creativity and imagination, as well as their knowledge of the Aboriginal flag and the use of symbols and key colours. We also had a reading to the students at lunchtime in the library. They read 'The Outback' by Annaliese Porter and Bronwyn Bancroft.

In the first week back of Term 3 we had a variety of sustainability focused

activities, incursions, excursions, challenges and prizes for the students and the wider school community. This also includes attending a 'Night Walk' run by the Friends of Braeside Park group on a night during the week, hosted at Braeside Park.

Once again, we have been selected as a top finalist for the Leader Local Grant competition. We have submitted an idea to build wicking beds for our Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden. Our sustainability Leaders look forward to attending the awards presentation and fingers crossed we will be a winner.



## **DINGLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL**

Term 3 is well under way after the much needed break, with both students and teachers raring to go. You will be aware from previous Dingley Primary School columns that we are a PYP school. We thought we'd enlighten you on what that means, how we approach teaching and learning, and the benefits that accrue to students from learning under this framework.

### What is PYP?

PYP stands for 'Primary Years Programme', and is one of four components of the International Baccaluareate – 'Primary Years Programme', 'Middle Years Programme', 'Diploma Programme' and 'Career-related Programme'. The International Baccalaureate (IB) is offered throughout the world by schools who have undergone extensive training and development in order to be authorised to teach the programme. The authorisation process is extensive, detailed and ongoing.

In essence the PYP develops internationally-minded students who learn how to think for themselves and take responsibility for their own learning through an inquiry-led approach. (The information in this column can either be found on the official IB website or is supported by it: https://www.ibo.org/ programmes/primary-years-programme/ what-is-the-pyp/)

## How does PYP differ to other approaches?

It is important to note that Dingley PS, like all Victorian IB schools, teaches to the curriculum standards as described by the Victorian Department of Education for Reading, Writing, Mathematics Number and Applied, History, Geography and so on. The difference is that we do it



under the umbrella of inquiry. Throughout the world PYP schools explore teaching and learning in accompaniment with 6 Units of Inquiry: 'Who We Are', 'Sharing the Planet', 'Where We Are In Place and Time', 'How the World Works', 'How We Organise Ourselves' and 'How We Express Ourselves'.

### How does it work?

To illustrate, the Year 2s are currently exploring the Unit of Inquiry 'How the World Works', focusing on the central idea 'Forces change the way things move'. In exploring this central idea we are addressing Victorian Curriculum standards in reading, writing, speaking & listening, design technologies, science, numeracy and critical & creative thinking. We are using students own toys to investigate the properties of force, have an incursion exploring 'Toys in Motion', are using the book Rollercoaster as a framework for reading, writing, speaking & listening and STEM, creating graphs and collating information for numeracy, and exploring push and pull in PE. This in-depth exploration of concept assists students with



taking their new-found knowledge outside the classroom, in effect seeing it operate in the real world and understanding that their learning is not isolated. Our goal is to ensure students never have the need to say 'when will I ever use this again?'

### Why do we believe PYP is best?

The Centre for Youth Studies, a wellrespected international think-tank, has conducted an analysis of employment trends and predicted that today's young people will have 17 jobs over the course of 5 different careers throughout their lifetime, and the crucial point is that many of those careers have not even been thought of yet. One of the most important skills students require is the ability to learn and to adapt that learning to as yet unknown potential. Fostering in students an inquiry-based approach to life facilitates the predicted requirements for navigating 21st Century life, as well as connecting them wholeheartedly to the world around them.
