SUMMER SAFETY

From heat health to fire safety, summer in Australia presents challenges and we need to be aware and prepared.

Whether you're staying put or holidaying far from home, keep fire safety top of mind, as we have seen in NSW and Queensland, bush fire can strike unexpectedly with devastating results. Be aware of weather conditions, fire bans and warnings in areas you may be visiting or travelling through.

Extreme heat causes more deaths in Australia than any other natural disaster. If left untreated, extreme heat can cause heat stroke, which is fatal in up to 80 per cent of cases.

The most at risk are the elderly, young children and those with existing health conditions. So take care of yourself and keep an eye on those around you. Plan your day around the heat - avoid being outdoors between 11am and 3pm.

The risk of food-borne illness is particularly high in summer, as bacteria multiply faster in hot weather.

Following simple precautions in the handling, storage and preparation of food will reduce the risk of food becoming unsafe. Plan your shopping to keep your perishable food items cool until you get home then refrigerate promptly as soon as you reach home. Limit the time food spends out of the fridge or freezer to the shortest time possible.

Keep all perishable food cold until serving, eat cooked food while it is still hot and refrigerate any leftovers as soon as possible.

In Australia we have one of the highest levels of UV exposure and highest rates of skin cancer in the world. Sun protection measures are recommended when the UV Index is 3 and above. Remember you can still get burnt on cool or cloudy days – so think UV, not heat. Take extra care between 11am and 3pm, wear clothes that cover as much of your skin as possible; apply a high-level water resistant sunscreen (SPF30+ or higher) regularly throughout the day; and wear a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses.

Even the strongest swimmers can get caught in a dangerous rip, while accidents around the pool can happen in a heartbeat. At the beach always swim between the red and yellow flags, which indicate the section is patrolled by Surf Lifesavers.

Never swim alone, at night, under the influence of alcohol or directly after a meal and always check water depth before diving in.

Children need constant supervision when they're in, on, or around the water.







Venomous reptiles & insects are part of our unique wildlife. When bushwalking or hiking, you can avoid snake and spider bites by wearing protective footwear. If bitten, seek immediate medical attention by phoning 000.

Epidemic thunderstorm asthma events can occur as late as December. Stay inside and close doors and windows during thunderstorms from October to December.

Never ignore asthma-like symptoms like shortness of breath, chest-tightness or coughing.

It goes to show how the community of Dingley Village can make a difference to others in the world when they deposit their unwanted foreign coins and notes in the foreign coin collection containers at the Bendigo Bank. A big thank you to the bank for your help with this project.

Dear President David.

We really appreciate the Rotary Club of Dingley's latest contribution of 12.2kg of coins (and two car wash tokens!) to the

district UNICEF foreign coin project which going on the average value of contributions will be valued at over \$350. I separated out the 2.7kg of 1 & 2 cent Aussie coins which they also want but value differently. I now have 53.6kg of coins, and a large wad of notes, towards the next 60kg batch. I am not sure if you have heard of the Australian Rotary Give Every child a future centenary project. It aims at immunising 100,000 children in the Pacific: https://www.everychildafuture.com It is a UNICEF project that Rotary has agreed to fund. UNICEF have said that all funds raised from our District 9810 foreign currency project will go towards Rotary's contribution until 2020. So, well done by your club and

the Dingley community which continues to support such a useful effort. We just need another 6.4kg of coins to make the total up to 460kg coins.

MASSIVE INVESTMENT IN LOCAL SPORTS NOW UNDERWAY

Sport in Kingston will receive an \$11 million boost thanks to a significant investment approved by Kingston Council.

Works are set to begin on four major projects after Council last night approved contracts for redevelopments at Roy Dore Reserve in Carrum, Jack Grut Reserve in Mordialloc, Aspendale Gardens Sports Grounds and Chadwick Reserve in Dingley Village. Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said Council was proud to be making significant investments to improve local sporting facilities.

"Many of our sporting pavilions were built half a century ago when sport was designed with only men in mind," Cr Oxley said. "We are transforming sporting facilities across all corners of Kingston to provide modern facilities with disability access and female-friendly change rooms, so they can be used by all," Cr Oxley said.

"This is a great use of ratepayer funds as these facilities not only serve thousands of local families taking part in a wide range of sports including AFL, cricket, soccer, netball and rugby but are also home to other community groups including Carrum Radio and the Mordialloc Brass Band."

Works will commence soon on:

- \$5.8 million Roy Dore Reserve redevelopment featuring a new pavilion and, sports lighting upgrades and (insert details here). Works are expected to begin in late 2019 and completed by late 2020.
- \$1.2 million Jack Grut Reserve Stage 2 redevelopment to replace the existing aged social room. The modular building will be built off-site and installed at the Mordialloc reserve in February/March 2020.

\$4.018 million to develop Stage One
works at Aspendale Gardens Sports
Grounds to provide 4 soccer pitches or
2 AFL sized ovals, cricket nets, sports
lighting, access road and carpark plus
at Chadwick Reserve sports fields and
sports lighting. Future stages will provide pavilions and landscaping works.
Works will commence in late 2019.

COMMUNITY'S VOICE MUST BE HEARD ON 5G ROLL-OUT

Kingston Council has called on telecommunications companies to properly consult and advise the community before rolling out the 5G network in the area.

Council believes telecommunications companies should advertise any proposed changes to ensure the surrounding community were kept well informed.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said currently very little notification is given and the community was often left in the dark.

"We want to see the same type of advertising as you would for a planning application, with neighbours alerted and signage displayed on site," Cr Oxley said.

"Our community has clearly said that a tiny ad in the back of the newspaper simply isn't good enough. Many people

Cr Oxley said that while Council did not have the power to enforce a change, it would be advocating strongly on behalf of the local community.

KINGSTON COUNCIL TO CEASE USE OF GLYPHOSATE WEED KILLER

Kingston Council will cease using Glyphosate weed killer to make local parks and reserves safer for all.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said Councillors had responded to community concerns about the use of Glyphosate weed killer in local parks following a recent 12-month trial. "We will be engaging hand weeding at all Council playgrounds as soon as possible and will be phasing out use in all other areas," Cr Oxley said.

"We will be immediately reducing our use of the weed killer and putting new arrangements in place so we can move towards being Glyphosate-free by 2020, where contractually possible."

Cr Oxley said Council had listened to community concerns and were happy to invest extra ratepayer funds in order to cease the use of Glyphosate.

"This will ease the concerns of our community and ensure our parks and reserves are kept safe and weed-free."

CR GEORGINA OXLEY RE-ELECTED AS KINGSTON MAYOR

Councillor Georgina Oxley has been reelected to lead the Kingston community for another 12 months as Mayor.

Cr Oxley, who was elected to the position of mayor at a special council meeting on 13 November, said she was humbled to once again be leading Council in her second term as Mayor. Cr Steve Staikos was re-elected deputy mayor.

Cr Oxley said Council had made significant achievements in the past 12

KINGSWOOD GOLF COURSE - THE GREEN CENTRE OF DINGLEY VILLAGE

At the end of 2018 Kingston Council voted unanimously to abandon the rezoning and development proposal for the Kingswood Golf Course. Council received a massive record breaking number of objections from the local community against any rezoning and redevelopment of the golf course to residential. Certainly a crystal clear message from our community to the owners of Kingswood.

One year on and the developer has just held several community meetings seeking "ideas about how you'd like the space developed". Please remember that Australian Super bought a golf course which was not and is not zoned residential and regardless of how much money they paid for this land, no residential development of Kingswood golf course can occur without a change of land zoning from Special Use Golf Course Zone to Residential.

Why did the Community fight so hard to keep Kingswood Golf Course?

There is no nett benefit to Dingley Village from rezoning and redeveloping Kingswood Golf Course. Since the sale of the golf course in 2014, the community has protested long and hard against development of the golf course that would cause:

- loss of our precious and increasingly scarce open space, bushland, trees and wildlife in the heart of Dingley Village.
- placing of further strain on our infrastructure; school overcrowding, road and traffic congestion, etc

Do not be fooled, the developers are feigning interest in what residents want on Kingswood golf course, however that does not conceal they still want to build hundreds of residential housing units on the Kingswood golf course.

They also have an ongoing programme of tree removal from Kingswood, under the guise of maintenance. Even big trees need water. It appears they are not replacing the trees on site.

PET CARE

KEEPING YOUR PET COOL DURING SUMMER

It's so important to make sure you're all prepared during hot weather to care for companion animals, and even wildlife. Read our tips to make sure your pets and other animals stay cool and calm during summer.




1. KEEP IT COOL

All pets must be kept in cool, shady areas. It is ideal to bring pets indoors on hot days. If you're feeling warm, chances are they are too.

Short nosed or flat faced dogs breeds are also more susceptible to heat stroke e.g. Pugs, English bulldogs, French bulldogs.

2. LITTLE ONES **NEED CARE** TOO

Small pets, such as rabbits, guinea pigs and birds, are par-



these animals indoors during hot weather. If allowed free run in a laundry or bathroom, they will benefit from the cool tiles. If this is not possible, drape their cage with wet towels and provide a sturdy icepack or frozen water bottle for the animal to lean against so it can to regulate its own body temperature. Make sure the animals' enclosures are out of direct sunlight and protected from the sun as the shade moves throughout the day.



3. WATER WATER WATER!

Provide plenty of fresh, cool water in large water containers. Be sure to provide numerous sources of water in case one is spilt. Ensure the containers are in the shade and add some ice to the water to keep it cool.



4. TAKE A DIP

Place a clam shell pool in the shade and fill it with water so your dog can wade in the water to keep cool. If your pet's share your yard with children, remember to have all necessary precautions in place, including fencing, in order to keep children safe.



5. WATCH WHEN YOU WALK

Walking your dog when the ground is too hot can cause serious damage to their paws. Instead, walk your dog in the coolness of the early morning or evening. If you're unsure if it's cool enough, press your hand to the pavement for 5 seconds. If it's too hot for your hand, it's too hot for your dog's paws.

It can also be a good idea to take your pet to your local beach, creek or river to let them have a paddle and cool down. This will help your pet avoid possible

dehydration, sunburn and potentially painful paws and it will help you and your pet enjoy the walk more.



6. KEEP THEM **COMFORTABLE**

If your pet seems to be in discomfort, try wetting their feet and misting water onto their face. This is an option for dogs, cats, ferrets, poultry and caged birds as many animals control their inner temperature through their feet. It's important not to saturate a bird's feathers as this can cause them to go into shock.



7. ANIMALS IN HOT CARS

NEVER leave your pet in the car in warm weather. It takes only minutes for an animal to suffer an agonising death if left in a hot car.

If you see an animal locked in a hot car, immediately phone police on 000.



8. TAKE CARE OF WILDLIFE

Leave small bowls of water in your garden so wildlife can keep cool.



9. PROTECT THOSE SNOOTS

Little pink noses are cute, but can easily become sunburnt. Your fair-skinned pet needs a special sunscreen for animals to protect it from the discomfort of sunburn and the added risk of skin cancer, so don't forget that 'slip, slop, slap' doesn't just apply to people.

10. DON'T SHAVE DOUBLE **COATED DOGS**

You may think you're doing your dog a kindness by shaving their hair to cool them down. However double coats are designed to keep dogs warm or cool depending on the weather. Dogs naturally shed their undercoat during summer,



allowing their skin to remain cool. If shaved, growing back this undercoat can make dogs even hotter. Their top coat also vitally prevents sunburn.

Shaving double coated dogs can also permanently change their coat, often losing its soft smooth texture. While grooming is important all year round, double coated dogs don't need to be shaved in any weather.

WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO RETIRE?

There has been much social and political debate since the federal government proposed pushing out the age at which Australians can access the age pension. Although most occupations don't have a legislated retirement date, there is little doubt that our tax and social security systems do have a significant impact on when many of us retire and how we plan to do it. Here are a few examples:

• I'll retire when I can get the age pension

For some people this will be a necessity. They can't afford to retire unless the pension is there to support them. Access to the age pension depends on your date of birth. Since 1 July 2017, the qualifying age for the age pension for men and women is 65½ years. It rises by six months every two years until it reaches 67 by 1 July 2023. The government is keen to see the pension age increase to 70 by 2035 but that has become a political football. If your retirement doesn't line up exactly with the relevant pension age, there may be some good alternatives to consider. If you leave work earlier, would you consider drawing on your retirement savings for a year or two before the pension begins? Alternatively, working for a couple of years past pension age could qualify you for the Work Bonus which financially rewards age pensioners who wish to continue working.

I'll stop work when I can get my hands on my superannuation

Generally, unless you die, become disabled or suffer financial hardship, the earliest time you can draw on your super is when you reach the so-called 'preservation age'. Again, this is different for people of different birth years: 55 if you were born before mid-1960 and rising gradually to 60 for those born after July 1964. There are also political rumblings that the preservation age could be increased. There could be other options you may want to consider, such as drawing on non-super savings if you retire earlier, but careful weighing up the pros and cons of this beforehand is crucial.

• I will wait until my super is tax-free Waiting until after you reach 60 to ac-

cess your super tax-free is a good option if you're ready to retire at what is, these days, a relatively young age. The downside of retiring "early" at 60 is that your retirement savings must last the distance and given that Australians are living longer, this could be at least another two decades. However, with good advice, there can be many opportunities to structure a suitable tax-effective retirement plan no matter when you plan to leave the workforce. The decision of when to call it quits can be a difficult one emotionally and financially. 

INTERNATIONAL CORNEA AND CONTACT LENS CONGRESS: A SNEAK PEEK

Last month I was fortunate to attend the International Cornea and Contact Lens Congress (ICCLC), held on the sunny shores of Noosa. Every two years worldclass clinicians, researchers and industry representatives from both home and abroad meet with delegates to share their insights through lectures, presentations & practical workshops. The therapeutic treatment of ocular surface disease, orthokeratology (Ortho K) and the fitting of large-diameter, rigid, scleral lenses in the context of dry eye, ocular trauma and corneal ectasia (thinning of cornea) were thoroughly explored. Contact lenses and in particular, the role of Ortho K in managing the excessive axial elongation seen in progressive myopia (short-sightedness) is of particular interest to me.

Half of the global population is

predicted to be shortsighted by the year 2050. Progressive myopia not only requires increasingly complex refractive solutions for clear vision, it puts the eye at risk of sight threatening disease including early cataract, glaucoma, retinal detachment and macular disease. The burden of sight loss is far reaching and has tremendous implications for a person's independence and state of mind, not to mention the broader effects it can place on communities at large. Therefore, pursuing whatever means available to stifle the consequences of pathological myopia is incredibly worthwhile. In relative terms, its management is a newly emerging field within optometry; research on the matter is released at dizzying rates. For each question answered several others emerge. Events such as the ICCLC

help relate cutting edge thinking back to clinical practice where it can be used to great benefit and I am grateful for the experience gained.







DINGLEY PRIMARY SHOOL

One of the things we pride ourselves on at Dingley Primary School is the breadth of activities we offer our students, both within the curriculum and as additions to it. Encouraging students to stretch themselves by providing opportunities for in-depth exploration and implementation of theoretical concepts, our many extracurricular activities foster, among other things, leadership, personal development and insight into career options. One program which offers all of these elements is the Energy Breakthrough Challenge. Every two years the chance to compete in the Energy Breakthrough Challenge is offered to students in Years 5 and 6, ensuring each student at Dingley Primary School has the possibility of being a team member before they graduate.

The Energy Breakthrough Challenge is a celebration whereby students from both city and country schools come together to share their experiences of working as a team, learning about alternative energy and environmentally friendly means of transport. All team members must complete a project relating to the event, for example: alternative energy, training, healthy eating, changes and modifications, team members, safety, how the vehicle works, and fundraising. These projects are orally and visually presented to a panel of three judges who then question the team about their

projects, their knowledge and understanding.

This year we have two2 teams entered into the Human-Powered Vehicle (HPV) event, a total of 20 students form the two2 teams, 10 boys and 10 girls. The event involves three stages: Display and Presentation (20 minutes); Design and Construction (scrutineering), and; Race. The Race itself is preceded by a time trial to determine starting grid position, following which there is an endurance race over two2 days. The Endurance race is a gruelling event in the heat at Maryborough (the nights are however freezing). The ten members of each team rotate in the HPV, allowing enough time to cool off in the pool, eat and recover. Even though it's a tough event the stu-

dents come away from it fitter, mentally stronger, confident public speakers, capable and cooperative team members and more environmentally aware. Each student must also raise \$250 in order to compete, a mammoth undertaking, which gives them a true understanding of money in the real world.

The whole school gets behind the teams, with a school disco the main method of fundraising to cover the large cost of providing the event. Students line the school track to watch the 'cars' whizz by as the competitors are put through time-trials and learn how to finely manipulate the HPVs. Speeches are practiced in front of classes from other year levels, eliciting curiosity and questions aplenty. We also enlist the help, encouragement and support of the Dingley community. Many individuals are involved in getting the students and equipment competition ready, but none more so than our wonderful PE teachers, Fleur Dean and Deb Lowther, who donate theirs and their families' personal time to ensure the students have the best opportunity to succeed.


