OUR COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

We are very lucky in Dingley Village to have a group of hardworking dedicated volunteers who make up the Dingley Village Community Association (DVCA).

The Dingley Village Community Association is a community organisation dedicated to enhancing the village life, housing, parks, infrastructure and services in Dingley Village, working closely with the Kingston City Council and local groups.

They do this by advocating on behalf of the community, they consult, make submissions, provide feedback, collaborate, network and support other community groups

The DVCA has developed a proactive effective working relationship with City of Kingston Council and is often the first point of contact by council when seeking feedback or engagement with the community. DVCA also works with other levels of government, Statutory bodies (e.g. Vic Roads), many other community groups and sporting clubs within Dingley and outside.

To do this requires hours of planning, submission writing, report reading and multiple on site or in office meetings with our local politicians, North ward councillors, council officers and engineers, contractors and other community groups e.g. Defenders of the South Eastern Green Wedge; Save Kingswood Group, the DVNC etc. In addition many letters and phone calls are part of each issue.

Members of the DVCA committee also give their time as members



of many other community groups e.g. Members of the DVCA committee also give their time as members of many other community groups e.g. Community Aviation Consultation Group, Make a Difference, DSEGW, RAMPF, DVMS, local churches. This allows a flow of information to support common interests.

CURRENT PROJECTS IN WHICH THE DVCA IS INVOLVED INCLUDE...

- a) The preservation of Kingswood Golf course as public open space.
- b) The improvements to parking at the netball courts.
- c) The development of the Hawthorn Football club centre.
- d) The proposed Mornington Peninsula Freeway extension.
- e) The purchase of land for Spring Park and the future development of the Park.
- f) The formation of a "Friends of Spring Park" group to work with council.
- g) The provision of a pedestrian crossing across Centre Dandenong Rd. to more safely access all our health providers' offices.

- h) Looking at a daytime permanent 40kph speed limit on Centre Dandenong Rd
- Monitoring dogs off leash in the on leash area of Spring Park and advising council. This is a problem, which is preventing some residents (frightened of dogs) from enjoying the park.

ONGOING ISSUES...

- a) Monitoring on-going rubbish dumping in Dingley Village, on nature strips, in the shopping centre etc., reporting to council for cleanup.
- b) Reporting graffiti, damage to facilities, traffic signs etc.
- c) Monitoring Moorabbin airport flight paths, noise, buildings & safety.

OUR COUNCIL

City of Kingston lobbied Federal candidates to support local projects in Kingston during election campaign

Kingston Council called on federal parties to invest in key local projects including sporting infrastructure, public transport and support for industry in the lead-up to the Federal election on 18 May.

Kingston Council is seeking Federal funding for eight key projects of regional significance:

- Creation of a new regional sporting facility at the Delta site in Kingston's Green Wedge to help meet skyrocketing demand as a result of increasing female participation and a growing population in Melbourne's southeast.
- Investment in a pipeline to pump recycled water to Kingston's Green Wedge to serve market gardens, golf courses, sporting fields and parklands.
- Improved safety at Moorabbin Airport with tighter controls on how close warehouses can be built near the runways and residential boundaries.
- Creation of a freight rail hub in Dandenong South to serve the south-east industrial precinct. This will reduce the number of trucks on local roads and make it easier, quicker and more

- cost-effective for industry to transport goods.
- Increased action on climate change, in-line with Kingston's Climate Change Strategy which is working to reduce Council and the community's emissions levels.
- Improve bandwidth speeds provided via the NBN to key industrial precincts to help businesses stay competitive in a global market and provide local jobs.
- Melbourne's biggest jobs hub outside the CBD is the Monash Jobs Hub, which includes areas of Kingston, but the area needs significant transport investment to ensure it remains strong over the next 30 years.
- Funding support to upgrade the Kingston Heath regional sporting complex, a key site for soccer, hockey and baseball in Melbourne's southeast.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said the key regional projects would make a significant difference by investing in vital transport, infrastructure and sporting facilities. "In the lead-up to 18 May election we called on all parties to commit to supporting these key projects and invest in the local community," Cr Oxley said. "We're keen to work in partnership with the Australian Government to deliver high-quality services to Kingston and the entire region."

ARE THREE STOREY HOUSES COMING TO DINGLEY VILLAGE?

HAVE YOUR SAY - CITY OF KINGSTON DRAFT HOUSING AND NEIGHBOURHOOD CHARACTER STUDY

In the recently released draft Housing and Neighbourhood Character Study, most of Dingley Village residential areas have been designated Limited Change Area zoning, with a 2 storey height limit on future housing.

However for a significant part of Dingley Village, a different zoning has been proposed - Incremental Change Area zoning - which allows future housing of up to three storeys high.

Consequently, medium density 3-story blocks of flats could be built all along Centre Dandenong Rd, on the Kingswood Golf Course Driving Range and around Dingley Village shopping centre, including the streets adjacent to Corrigan Oval, which will overstrain our infrastructure and destroy our unique Neighbourhood Character.

To stop large-scale medium density housing development in our Village, **DVCA urges you to object against**

the *Incremental Change Area* zoning proposed for:

- any areas more than 400 metres away from the Dingley Village shopping centre, and
- the Kingswood Golf Course driving range

Council recently released the draft Housing and Neighbourhood Character Study for community consultation enabling us to have our say about these important issues for our Village and Municipality.

The Study has been developed over the past 2 years and sets out the types of development preferred in different parts of Kingston to manage housing growth over the next 20 years, designating where areas of minimal, incremental and substantial change may be appropriate.

NEIGHBOURHOOD CHARACTER - DINGLEY VILLAGE

A detailed assessment of Neighbourhood Character has been made and Dingley Village is designated as Garden Court 1, being characterised by:

"Spacious residential areas in a garden setting comprising street patterns of winding streets and cul-de-sacs with a range of dwelling types in landscaped surrounds."

DINGLEY VILLAGE PROPOSED NEW RESIDENTIAL ZONES

1. Incremental Change Area Zone

Along Centre Dandenong Rd, the Kingswood Golf Course Driving Range and around the Dingley Village shopping centre, including the streets adjacent to Corrigan Oval, a zoning of Incremental Change Area is proposed for these areas, with the following objectives:

- encourage moderate housing growth while maintaining a high proportion of detached dwellings and diversification of townhouses, units and dual occupancies
- ensure new development contributes to the preferred neighbourhood character
- future housing up three stories (11 metres).

2. Limited Change Area Zone

Other Dingley Village residential areas have a proposed zoning of Limited Change Area, with the following objectives:

- encourage low density housing types
- ensure retention of existing housing
- ensure new development contributes to the preferred neighbourhood character
- retain opportunities for household types and sizes that may require larger dwellings and gardens
- future housing limited to one or two stories (4 to 9 metres).

Dingley Village is a wonderful place to live - we have a lot to protect - so please take the time to view the Study and give your feedback prior to Sunday 16th June 2019.





MEDICAL MATTERS

BOWEL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH





Australia has one of the highest rates of bowel cancer in the world and June is Bowel Cancer Awareness Month.

Bowel cancer (also known as colorectal cancer) is the third most common type of newly diagnosed cancer in Australia.

1 in 13 Australians will be diagnosed with bowel cancer in their lifetime.

15,604 Australians are told they have bowel cancer each year, including

1,413 people under the age of 50. While the risk of bowel cancer increases significantly with age, the disease doesn't discriminate, affecting men and women, young and old.

Bowel cancer is Australia's second deadliest cancer and claims the lives of 5,375 Australians every year, including 292 people under the age of 50.

Know your family medical history, for around 30% of bowel cancer cases, there is a family history or hereditary contribution.

Bowel cancer is one of the most treatable types of cancer if found early. 98% of bowel cancers cases can be treated successfully if found early but fewer than 50% are detected early.

You can reduce your risks through modifying your diet and lifestyle and through regular bowel screening appropriate to your risk level. Bowel screening involves testing for bowel cancer in people who do not have any obvious symptoms of the disease. The National Bowel Cancer Screening Program is free to eligible Australians aged 50 – 74 years. You will automatically receive your free kit in the mail if you are eligible. Bowel cancer screening test kits can also be purchased for low cost from Bowel Cancer Australia.

See your doctor if you are experiencing any of these symptoms for two weeks or more: blood in bowel movement, unexplained weight loss, persistent change in bowel habit, severe abdominal pain.



This is some information regarding secondary schools and our residents' interest.

SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Dingley Village has never had its own secondary school. Dandenong High School opened in 1919 and was one of the first accessible state secondary schools for Dingley Village children to attend.

In 1975, when the combined enrolment of primary schools in Dingley Village reached almost one thousand students, families were keen to instigate the construction of a local secondary school.

When considering the proposal to build a secondary school in Dingley Village, Springvale Council took into account the rapid population growth, however, predictions of the future population of Dingley Village also factored into their decision.

TO GIFT OR NOT TO GIFT? WHAT ABOUT YOUR PENSION?

With Australia's age pension being subject to an assets and income test, a simple way for part-pensioners to increase their pension payments is to give away some assets.

Not surprisingly the government is on to such an obvious strategy. It's called gifting, and while it is perfectly legal for you to give away whatever you want whenever you want, if you exceed the relevant limits, Centrelink will continue to assess, what it calls "deprived assets", for five years.

The limits

Gifting is defined as giving away assets or transferring them for less than their market value. Limits are the same for both singles and couples.

If you give away less than \$10,000 within a single financial year and no more than \$30,000 over five consecutive financial years, Centrelink will disregard these gifts.

Any gifts in excess of the allowable amount will be assessed as an asset (and, where applicable, subject to the income test) for a period of five years from when the gift was made.

These rules don't just apply to existing pensioners. They also concern anyone who is applying for the age pension, as recent retiree Frank discovered.

Frank has reached age pension age and based on his current assets and income he should be eligible for a part pension. However:

- Four years ago he gave his daughter one of his cars, valued at \$25,000.
- At the same time he gave his son \$25,000 in cash, to match the value of the car.
- Two years ago Frank sold a beach house on the open market for \$210,000. This was \$40,000 less than the initial valuation from the estate agent.
- In the past year he spent \$35,000 on home renovations and \$15,000 on an overseas trip.

What does this mean for his pension assessment?

The money spent on renovations and holidays count as normal living expenses, not a gift. Likewise, with \$210,000 being the best offer Frank received for his holiday home after it had been on the market for a couple of months, the property would not be considered to have been disposed of for less than its market value.

Whilst he understands that the money he gave to his son is clearly a gift, Frank's biggest surprise is the treatment of the car. Four years after he gave it to his daughter it's about to be treated by Centrelink as an asset Frank still owns. That means Frank gave away \$50,000 in one year. The annual 'Gifting Free Area' is \$10,000, so the difference, \$40,000, will be counted as an asset for the next year.

This will reduce his pension by more than \$100 per fortnight.


If Frank had thought about his pension five years before he was eligible to apply for it, he could have achieved a better outcome.

HOW TO PAY OFF YOUR HOME LOAN **FASTER AND SAVE BIG BUCKS**

Reducing the life of your loan isn't difficult; there are many simple things you can do to cut years off your mortgage. Here are some tips that will help you be mortgage-free sooner, from a client interview.

Small extra repayments

are paid fortnightly.

"All you have to do is pay half your monthly minimum payment each fortnight to save \$56,000 interest and pay off your mortgage more than 5 years faster"

Ensuring your loan allows extra repayments without penalty will let you to make the most of bonuses. Interest expense is calculated by banks on a daily basis, so funnelling extra payments into a loan saves interest immediately, as does an offset account, which will use your savings or living expenses to reduce your principle, while still allowing you to access these funds from a transaction account.

"A popular loan option available now (April 2019) is fixed for 3 years at rate 3.65%, with no ongoing fees and a 100% offset account attached. Because interest is calculated daily but charged monthly, any money sitting in the offset account will help reduce the loan interest expense and term remaining. This option allows certainty of minimum bank repayments and the ability to pay your loan off faster"

REDUCING SCREEN TIME AND MORE **OUTDOOR PLAY ESSENTIAL FOR DEVELOPMENT**

In 2017, the Australian Department of Health released "The 24-Hour Movement Guidelines". These guidelines were developed by Australian and Canadian childhood health experts, to outline what an ideal day for any infant, toddler or preschool aged child should resemble. This was particularly focused on the amount of time each age group spent in front of screens, actively playing, sitting and lying down, and sleeping.

From the 2017 guidelines, screen time in particular was recommended against, for all infants from birth to one year and only 1 hour in a 24 hour period for children aged 1-5 years of age. There was an overall emphasis on physical activity, starting with 30 minutes of tummy time and interactive floor play for infants, and at least 180 minutes of physical activity of varied intensities for children from 1-5 years of age.

Overall, the recommendations at the time were clear - more physical activity and less sedentary screen time was highly beneficial for a child's overall health and wellbeing.

Just recently, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has developed their own set of guidelines and recommendations specific to young children's health, which essentially reinforce those findings from the 24-Hour Movement Guidelines from 2017.

Not only do these guidelines safeguard the development of young children at a crucial time of their physical and mental growth, the emphasis on as little screen time as possible will be beneficial in the protection of children against the development of myopia (shortsightedness).

Myopia already affects 30% of the global population, and is predicted to rise to affect 50% of the world by 2050. This rise is due to less time spent outdoors doing physical activity and more sedentary behaviour, which typically involves a screen based task, as is the nature of our current society.

Too much screen time is detrimental to visual development but Professor Tony Okely, the lead researcher on the 2017, has also found that it has the potential to delay language, reduce attention and lead to poorer decision making.

Myopia development will affect a person's life, as it increasingly becomes

more difficult to see things clearly further away i.e. the board at school or driving.

COMMENCING A BUSINESS

Have you already thought of a brilliant business idea? Have you even mapped out the operations of the business? Although these two items are essential prerequisites of getting a business up and running, they are only a start as, apart from accounting matters, it is essential to turn your mind to certain legal considerations involved in starting a business.

Business Structures

A sole trader business structure is the most simplest and affordable business structure to set up and operate. The requirement is that the business will be operated by one individual and only requires an Australian Business Number ('ABN') and a trading name. Obviously, this business structure is not suitable if there is more than one business partner or you require a greater level of asset and legal protection.

A partnership business structure involves two or more people operating a business and therefore sharing the profits. This also means that both business partners will be individually and jointly liable for the business liabilities and debts. The requirement is that a partnership agreement will need to be drawn up

and in turn makes this business structure a little more complex than the sole trader business structure.

A company business structure is a separate legal entity which essentially reduces your personal liability in the sense that it separates the company's liabilities and debts from you. A company can be operated individually or with multiple people, with the involvement of directors and shareholders. Although this is the more favourable structure to use if investors are required to invest in the business, it is also the most complex and expensive structure to set up and maintain.

In addition to the above, there are also other complex structures such as unit trusts, trusts, limited partnership etc. Where appropriate, detailed legal and accounting advice should be sought prior to using these complex structures.

ABN Registration

An ABN is a number that allows the government to identify the business and to ensure the business is legitimate. Each business structure requires an ABN. To hold a valid ABN, the business must provide products or services to customers or be a registered Australian company. ABN details must be updated regularly.

Taxation

Each business structure has different tax considerations and requirements involved. A sole trader is required to use their own personal tax file number and lodge tax returns each year. A partnership or company must apply for a separate tax file number and again, file their own tax returns each year. The business must also be registered for GST if it earns more than a certain amount. Advice from an accountant or tax lawyer should be obtained on a business structure being selected as there will be critical tax and other legal issues to consider.

Insurance

The equipment and contents of the business required to operate must be adequately protected by way of business insurance. An insurance broker can give advice on the best insurance options which will take into consideration the coverage and costs involved.

Although it is not a legal requirement for all businesses, public liability insurance may also be required if interacting closely with customers. There are also specific insurance schemes under each State that a business needs to be aware of if engaging team members that may be injured at work.

Business name registration

The availability of a business name must be checked on the Australian Securities and Investment Commission's ('ASIC') website and the Australian Trade Marks Register. If the business name is not in use, it can be registered through ASIC.

This will become the legal trading name and be listed on the public register.

Trade Marks

If you have a business name, style and logo that represents the business, it is recommended to apply for trade mark registration which allows the business to own the intellectual property and how it is used by the employees, customers, suppliers and distributors. This will also allow you to enforce your rights against others who misuse the name.

Employees and Contractors

The best practice to put in place is employee agreements in order to set out the terms of the relationship. Such an agreement can include probationary periods, remuneration, working hours and disciplinary processes. A modern award outlines the minimum conditions the employees are entitled to including breaks, overtime and wages. There are several modern awards and you will need to understand which modern award is applicable to your case. A business owner also needs to be familiar with Pay As You Go Instalments ('PAYG') and superannuation payments when employing full-time, part-time and casual employees.

On the flip side, the business may not require employees but only requires independent contractors. There are many regulations surrounding independent contractors and it would be best to consult professionals or consider on line resources of Fair Work and the ATO to determine whether an individual is an employee or a contractor as crucial and costly tax and legal consequences flow from this. A contractor agreement should be put in place to set out key terms such as payments, their obligations, and outlining that relationship is an independent contractor relationship and not an employee relationship.

Regulations

Sometimes a licence to operate a business may be required depending on the products and services the business is providing. Building commissions, fair trading and industry bodies usually inform the business of which licence is required, and some examples includes trades, food services and health providers. It is also best practice to check with

the local council to ensure you do not require any permits or prior approvals to operate the business.

The key take away here is to ensure the business structure decided upon is suitable, protecting your interests by registering the business name and ABN, sorting out the tax requirements and protecting your employees and contractors.




