### KINGSTON POKIES LOSSES TOP \$85 MILLION

Australia has the worst gambling culture in the world, it is so endemic in our culture and it's a whole community concern. Victorians lost \$2.698 billion on poker machines in the 2018-19 financial year, the second highest amount of losses since pokies were introduced to the state.

There are 898 poker machines at 16 venues, within the City of Kingston, yet under Victorian Government laws our area could have up to 1,213 electronic gaming machines (EGMs).

And this number could grow further as our population increases.

This is despite the fact that Kingston consistently rates third in the state for the highest number of licenced venues, the sixth highest for number of poker machines and within the top 10 for amount of money lost – with a staggering \$85+million lost each year. And this number is growing. Last year the amount lost to poker machines in Kingston jumped almost 4% in just 12 months.

Dingley International Hotel had the dubious honour of raking in the most money in the area, with \$15.6 million from 90 machines — more than all of the City of Bayside's venues combined.

Moorabbin's Sandbelt Club hotel was second with \$11.2 million, in front of Royal Oak on \$9.1 million.

The City of Kingston and the community are calling on the Victorian Government to make urgent changes to gaming laws to reduce the devastating impact of poker machines in Kingston.



Council has also joined forces with the Alliance for Gambling Reform, a national organisation working to minimise harm caused by poker machines.

### WHY POKER MACHINES ARE A PROBLEM.

Research has found that more than 70% of people who use poker machines experience some level of harm, and that poker machines are the cause of most gambling-related problems. What's worse, the people who are harmed by poker machines are more likely to be from lower income areas who least can afford the losses.

Each year that's \$85 million dollars that could be better spent on people's vital needs including housing, health, education and food.

People most vulnerable problem gambling are those facing social isolation, from disadvantaged communities and from multicultural / non-English speaking backgrounds.

And it's not just problem gamblers that pay the price. Research has found that of all the harm caused by gambling in Victoria, 15% impacts problem gamblers, 35% moderate-risk gamblers and 50% to low-risk gambling. And the harm of gambling also causes widespread ripples in the community with the Productivity Commission estimating that every person with a gambling problem has an adverse impact on another 7.3 people. The whole community can suffer.

Research has also found it is a contributing factor to family violence with problem gamblers more likely to be both victims and perpetrators of family violence. And sadly more than half of problem gamblers have used physical violence against their own children.

The harm caused by poker machines is clear and simply cannot be ignored.



## Letters to the Editor

### It has begun.

The assault on Braeside Park began by bulldozing heathland for construction workers' sheds. Road signs, warning of traffic delays, are on Lower



Dandenong Road just beyond Howards Road. The next few weeks will see the destruction of the trees in the path of their Freeway.

At the same time, Dingley Village residents learnt that "most of the grass at a former golf course caught in the five-year redevelopment battle has been chemically killed." The property fund giant ISPT [owned by superannuation fund Australian Super] says it is part of regular maintenance." (Moorabbin Leader, 9 October 2019)

Parks Victoria will soon hold a meeting with our own Friends' Committee, and that of the Men's Shed, about their Precinct Planning for Braeside Park – so we can both be consulted about new developments.

### Who is standing up for Biodiversity?

The State Government and its agencies, Parks Victoria and VicRoads, and big businesses like ISPT have their agenda. Do we? Do you?

Is it any wonder that Braeside Park's Eucalyptus trees are battered by Lerp insects? Many visitors are puzzled and worried by the "dying trees" throughout the Park. Lerp, jumping plant lice called Psyllids, are a common and diverse group of sap-sucking insects. Eucalyptus trees are prone to infestations of lerps and they usually recover. The Park's invasion of lerps has been expanding over the past two years: about the time of Mordialloc Freeway; Parks Victoria cutting the number of Rangers in our Park; and high-density schemes for the secretly sold Golf Course. The lerp pests are most common along the proposed Freeway's path.

It is not known precisely why the lerps have suddenly exploded. This usually happens after a succession of unusual weather conditions. Healthy, vigorously growing eucalyptus can outgrow the damage, but the attack can be a sign of trees under stress. Stress caused by wind, root damage, compacted soil, salinity, drought – all mostly caused by humans'

movements by cars, trucks etc. What our trees have endured and continue to endure, and what we endure as well, of course.

On Sunday 13 October's Friends' Spring Walk, sixteen people viewed a panorama of flowering white wedding bush, white Epacris bells, yellow senecio, hibbertia and bossiaea with a background of correas, banksia, melaleucas and acacias. Amid a bouquet of dianellas

and a grass tree, an echidna enjoyed an afternoon siesta. This is what our Park is about!

### Who is standing up for Biodiversity?

What is our Group's plan? Will we continue to be a polite community group, ticked off in consultation processes? We could listen to the State Government and big business lie about how they care about biodiversity, and our views. Then, they systematically destroy habitats and then plant a token few banksias beside the concrete. "How good is Australia!"

### KINGSTON CALLS FOR COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ON THE FUTURE OF GOLF COURSES

Kingston Council has called on the Victorian Government not to lock-out local Councils and communities when deciding the future of golf courses

The Victorian Government has proposed new state-wide planning guidelines for golf course redevelopments, including local sites such as the former Kingswood Golf Course in Dingley Village.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said that if approved, the new guidelines could remove Councils from the process.

"It effectively reduces Council's role to that of a submitter – rather than a key decision maker on behalf of the local community," Cr Oxley said.

"Kingswood has clearly shown that the local community want to have a strong voice in the future of local golf courses, with a record 7000+ community submissions received on a proposed residential development for the site that was refused by Council."

There are currently 11 golf courses in Kingston which, while largely privately owned, provide the local community with valuable open space, recreational areas and environmental benefits.

In 2015 Kingston Council adopted a Golf Course Policy which acknowledges the benefits that golf courses provide and sought to ensure that if a club was economically unviable that the land would be retained primarily for open space.

Council has made a submission to the Victorian Government calling for changes to the proposed new planning guidelines that will direct the future of golf courses across the state including:

 Putting more focus on encouraging and supporting existing golf clubs to remain financially viable and open  Ensuring any redevelopment of golf courses have clear 'net community benefit' such as open space and environmental benefits

"Kingston Council does not believe that golf courses should be seen as an answer to accommodate population growth as it would put increasing pressing on community infrastructure, active and passive open space, affordable housing and the environment."

### KINGSTON GARDENS GOING GREEN FOR NATIVE WILDLIFE

Kingston backyards will become havens for native animals thanks to a new Gardens for Wildlife program approved by Council.

The project will provide homeowners with an assessment of their garden and practical tips to attract native birds, animals and insects.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said the Gardens for Wildlife program had been introduced following community calls to support the program which already runs in a number of other municipalities.

"Gardens for Wildlife is a great way for Council and the community to work together to provide much-needed habitat for our native animals," Cr Oxley said.

"Residents provide the garden and Council will offer an expert assessment and advice to get you on your way."

"With Council working to increase vegetation in parklands and residents adding to their backyards we can increase the amount of habitat in our neighbourhoods and attract native wildlife."

Council will appoint a part-time officer to run the program and support local residents looking to create a wildlifefriendly garden.

This year, Council also introduced a free tree voucher sent to all ratepayers to encourage more planting of native trees in our community to help green our city with over 1500 trees handed out so far."

### KINGSWOOD GOLF COURSE VEGETATION UPDATE

### Statement from City of Kingston Planning and Development General Manager Jonathan Guttmann:

Australian Super and ISPT, the owners of the former Kingswood Golf Course site, contacted Kingston Council Officers, seeking permission to remove or prune 75 trees on the site. The site presently contains approximately 1,500 trees and Council Officers have made it very clear that the vegetation on the site requires protection and that appropriate approvals are sought prior to any removal.

An inspection and arborist audit were undertaken to assess the health of each tree, with sadly some found to be in poor health and showing evidence of root/branch rot. These inspections were audited by Council's arborist.

As a result, a permit was granted by Council Officers to remove 36 trees, which require a Local Law permit to be removed. A further 8 protected trees were also approved for pruning. A condition of the permit includes 1 for 1 replacement planting of indigenous canopy trees which is the type of condition Council imposes on private property owners seeking approval to remove trees.

Prior to the works commencing Council understands that the land owners sent an information bulletin letter-drop to immediately adjacent residents.

The Mayor and Councillors have requested that in future, they are to be made aware of any applications for tree removal on the Kingswood site.


The remaining 31 trees were assessed as 'native vegetation', which requires a planning permit for removal under Clause 52.17 of the Kingston Planning Scheme.

The owners have last week lodged a planning application for permission to remove/lop 11 of these trees and to lop overhanging branches from 3 other trees.

This application has been 'called in' by Cr Staikos for Councillor decision. This planning application is now being assessed by Council and will be advertised for community consultation once all required information is submitted.

Council officers have also visited the site late last week and formally sought an explanation from the land owner's representative regarding the 'browning off' of significant parts of the site.

We will also be flagging the need for owners to manage any dust on the site, so that it does not negatively impact on surrounding properties.

### SAVE THE TREES ON KINGSWOOD GOLF COURSE & PROTECT KINGSWOOD GOLF COURSE VEGETATION

### **NO LARGE-SCALE TREE REMOVAL AND VEGETATION** POISONING

#### WHAT HAS HAPPENED

Australian Super and ISPT applied to remove or prune a total of 75 trees in Kingswood Golf Course, with a permit to remove 36 trees of these trees and the pruning of a further 8 trees having been granted by Council. In addition large areas of the Kingswood Golf Course grass and rough (beneath the trees) were poisoned "browned off" during September. As the rough dies, in addition to the removal of the fairways, bare earth/sand will be exposed to winds and once again Dingley Village will suffer excess dust.

This was carried out without any consultation with the local community or Kingswood golf-course neighbours.

**DVCA does not support large-scale** tree removal on Kingswood and the subsequent disposal of the trees as mulch to the community.

DVCA does not approve the poisoning of large areas of golf course grass and the resultant devastating impact to the environment from this wholesale destruction of the golf course.

Herbicide poisoning using products such as Roundup, containing Glyphosate is now banned in many countries and are a threat to our waterways and a possible cause of cancer.

Large-scale tree removal and vegetation poisoning causes a major loss of wildlife habitat, impacting on the many birds and wildlife in the golf-course, such as the large flock of iconic yellow-tailed black cockatoos sighted over several weeks recently. These black cockatoos have been in rapid decline in recent years due to native habitat clearance and resultant loss of food supply and nest sites. Loss of Kingswood habitat and clearance of older trees with nesting hollows will further hasten the decline of native birds and wildlife in Dingley Village and surrounds.



### HOW CAN WE PROTECT KINGSWOOD TREES AND VEGETATION

The remaining 31 trees, which ISPT, as manager for the owner Australian Super, applied to destroy, were assessed as native vegetation under clause 52.17 of the Kingston Planning Scheme.

A further application to remove/lop 11 of these 31 "native vegetation" trees has now been 'called in ' by Cr Staikos, which means this application will be examined by Councillors, advertised and comments invited from residents prior to any permit decision being made by Council.

So, let's Save the Trees on Kingswood Golf Course - please make sure YOU HAVE YOUR SAY when Council advertises this application for tree removal. Kingswood is not only the lungs, but is also central to the survival of the wildlife in and around Dingley Village.

## INTEREST RATES CONTINUE MOVING DOWN

### ESTATE PLANNING AND WILLS – LOAN OR GIFT TO FAMILY

The question of whether a person gifts or loans to a family member (or friend) during their lifetime and how to deal with this in their will is often a pertinent question for estate planning purposes.

This article deals with the limited issue of gifts/loans. There are numerous other estate planning issues such as testamentary trusts, the form and other provisions in a person's will, testator family maintenance claims (disputing a will) etc. These matters are beyond the scope of this article but they do show that wills and estate planning ought not to be taken lightly or undertaken by people not suitably qualified in this regard.

### Gift

At a high level an unconditional gift is final disposition of property meaning that gift is carved out from the gift giver's estate and the gift giver not being able to demand its return.

Any unconditional gift must also be considered from the gift recipient's perspective especially as a gift will generally enlarge the recipient's assets and, therefore, may impact on family law, Centerlink and other purposes.

#### Loan

Conversely, a loan is not a final disposition of the property (generally money) and the giver/lender generally can recover the loan. Further, the lender can set the terms and conditions of the loan such as when it is to be repaid, whether interest will be payable.

For estate planning purposes of both the lender and borrower, a properly structured and documented loan can assist is managing family law, bankruptcy and taxation issues. However, where interest is charged on a loan, this may complicate issues for the lender as it will mean the lender will be creating a likely taxable income stream from the loan.

### Documentation

For both loan and gifts, the crucial element is that they be documented appropriately. Often people feel that documentation is not appropriate or required for family member or friends.

On the contrary, documentation is vital especially if one puts aside the emotional element of the loan or gift and considers documentation from the wider perspective of assisting with third parties such as State/Federal authorities, creditors and the person's estate generally.

The form and substance of any documentation should be according to the context of the loan/gift meaning it may be informal, a simple agreement or a more formal a deed.

#### Pre-existing gifts and loans in a will

Pre-existing gifts and loans can and should be dealt with in a person's will.

With gifts, it may be noted or acknowledged in the will. The will maker may also consider making adjustment in the will in other beneficiaries' favour (who have not received the gift), taking into account inflationary impact on the value of the gift, noting that assistance has been provided to a person or generally giving the executors of the estate discretion to take into account the gift.

A pre-existing loan should be recorded in the will. The will should deal with whether or not the loan is to be partially or fully forgiven at the will maker's death, whether it should be repaid immediately especially where it has been given on a "on demand" basis, whether to extend the repayment time after the will maker's death.

Eight consecutive finals campaigns since 2012 include four premierships from the last five years, is a record which is the envy of rival clubs.



We trust the relationships that we believe God has established with these displaced people will continue to be a blessing and help to them. They need security in their natural circumstances and salvation through a loving God.




