STAY SAFE ONLINE



The Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) has seen a significant increase in reporting in the past few months of COVID themed phishing scams, using all sorts of lures to try and trick people into handing over personal details.



Phishing and spear-phishing is a method of stealing confidential information by sending fraudulent messages to a victim, through email or message platforms. They remain among the most common method used by malicious cyber actors to target Australians. While phishing messages are commonly sent out in their thousands, spear-phishing campaigns are typically aimed at a particular group of recipients.

Since the pandemic's outbreak, the Government's Scamwatch has received over 3,060 coronavirus themed scam reports with over \$1,371,000 in reported losses.

To help you spot a fake email or SMS from a real one, the ACSC's Stay Smart Online program has launched an interactive phishing quiz.

"Phishing campaigns can be sent via email, SMS, social media, instant messenger or a phone call. They can look extremely convincing, often imitating legitimate messages from trusted senders in government or business," said ACSC Head Abigail Bradshaw CSC.


"The ACSC has observed numerous phishing emails that feature official logos and branding, together with the same font and layout as the organisation they pretend to come from. Head to our campaign page at www.cyber.gov. au/scam-messages to access the quiz, and see if you can spot the scam!" Ms Bradshaw said.

ACSC has a new-look website www. cyber.gov.au, including the ACSC's Stay Smart Online program. It is the ACSC's primary digital platform for individuals, businesses and government agencies to report cybercrime and cyber incidents, and to receive expert advice and guidance about cyber security.

If you have been a victim of a cybercrime, go to ReportCyber and report it.

You can also report scams to Scamwatch.

The future of those plans are also to be confirmed.


Throughout this period the club has been buoyed by the continued support of our loyal sponsors and we urge Dingley community to support those businesses.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2020

The City of Kingston elections will be held in October and will be conducted via postal vote.

The Victorian Government has introduced new wards for the City of Kingston. Previously, Kingston has been split into three wards (North, Central and South wards) with three councillors elected to represent each ward.

Kingston has been split into 11 wards, with one councillor to be elected to represent each ward and Dingley Village is located in the new Caruana Ward.

Who must vote in Council elections?

Voting in council elections is compulsory for all residents who are listed on the voters' roll. Residents on the voters' roll who do not vote may be fined if they do not have an acceptable reason.

Am I enrolled to vote?

You are already enrolled to vote in our next election if you meet the following 3 criteria:

 you will be at least 18 years of age on election day

- you live in Kingston, and
- you are on the state electoral roll for your current address.

You must be enrolled to vote by August 28 in order to vote, or run as a candidate, in the October 2020 Council elections.

To check your enrolment, or to update your details if you have moved in the past four years, visit the Victorian Electoral Commission Website

How do I vote?

The City of Kingston 2020 Council elections will be conducted via postal vote.

Voting packs will be sent to enrolled voters between October 6 and October 8.

(Please note: Voters in the same household may not receive their packs on the same day).

The voting packs will include information on all candidates in your ward and instructions on how to fill out the ballot form.

Enrolled voters must complete the voting pack and put it in the return post by 6pm 23 October.

Election results

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, counting of votes is expected to require greater time at this year's elections. For that reason, the VEC expects that final declarations for all councils may not be completed until 13 November 2020.

Council business during election period

Council will enter into a Caretaker Period from 22 September 2020 until the elections. During this time Council's Election Period Policy ensures that the business of local government in the City of Kingston continues throughout an election period in a responsible and transparent manner.

It sets out actions and procedures in accordance with statutory requirements and established election period conventions in the interests of a fair election generally, during the election period. This Policy builds on the minimum statutory standards to enhance the accountability of the Council, Councillors and Council staff during the election period.





OPEN-AIR ART BRINGS COLOUR AND CULTURE AMID COVID-19

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said with a new large-scale mural in Chelsea and a vibrant artwork in Parkdale there are many ways for the community to enjoy the work of local artists despite the lockdown.

"Now restrictions have been lifted a little and we can get out and about a bit more, I really encourage people to visit the Chelsea Sportswomen's Centre to check out the amazing mural painted by Geoffrey Carran," said Cr Oxley. "The mural pays homage to the Sharp-Tailed Sandpiper, which annually migrate from Siberia to our very own Edithvale Wetlands. It looks truly spectacular at sunset."

For families, a trip to Parkdale's Shirley Burke Theatre is a must. Although the building is closed to the public right now, local artist, Deb McNaughton has painted a bright mural on the facade.

"The joyful artwork pays homage to the Rainbow Trail movement which has inspired families to draw rainbows on their footpaths and driveways, as a sign of unity," said Cr Oxley. "There's already been an outpouring of love for the mural from the local residents walking and riding by. Make sure you bring the family and get down to Parkdale for a look."

"Or why not take a stroll along one of the City of Kingston's Historical Walking Trails and discover the rich history of Mentone and Mordialloc," Cr Oxley said. Pocket guides are available to download from the Kingston library website to accompany you on the walking trails. Each guide includes a trail map, so you won't get lost and a brief piece of history for each stop.

DELIVERING FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO THE COMMUNITY A KEY PART OF KINGSTON'S DRAFT BUDGET

Kingston Council has released a Draft Budget for 2020 – 21 that prioritises financial relief for residents and local businesses impacted by COVID-19, continuing the support package announced in March.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said Council had worked very hard to deliver a budget that has something in it for everyone in Kingston during this unprecedented time.

"These are very tough and uncertain times and Council has been able to put together a draft budget that continues to provide vital financial support for our residents and businesses while also delivering essential services, infrastructure repairs and important major projects to improve community facilities," said Cr Oxley.

"To assist ratepayers in our community who are struggling, Council will extend the \$112.20 Pensioner Rebate to ratepayers who are on the JobSeeker allowance and to businesses that are registered for the Federal Government JobKeeper payment scheme for the 2020/21 year."

In addition, no interest will be charged on overdue rates during 2020/21 and rates can also be deferred for payment until 30 June 2021.

Council will also continue to invest ratepayer funds to provide high-quality children's services, upgrade local Scout and Girl Guide Halls, roll-out library improvements and vital infrastructure including footpaths, roads and drainage

"We're continuing to invest in our beautiful foreshore as well, and ensuring our community has access to modern and well-maintained facilities, we're also making sure our environment is protected," Cr Oxley said.

The \$65.9 million capital works Budget features a wide range of projects, services and initiatives to support our community.

Budget highlights

Investing in sport and recreation facilities including the Dolamore Reserve athletic track renewal, the Ben Kavanagh Reserve Master Plan and netball courts, the soon to be launched Aspendale Gardens Pavilion and sports field, upgrading Dingley's Chadwick Reserve, completing the final stage of the G.H. Soppet Pavilion Redevelopment in Mentone, and putting the finishing touches on the new Dales Park netball centre in Oakleigh South.

Major investment in important community facilities including improving Scout and Girl Guide Halls to ensure they are accessible to all and refurbishing the 5th Mordialloc Sea Scouts building.

Maintaining vital community infrastructure including spending \$6.9 million on Kingston's roads and \$0.7m on footpath repairs. Another \$3.5 million will be spent on flood mitigation/drainage works.

Continuing to provide financial support Council will extend the Pensioner Rebate to ratepayers who are on the JobSeeker allowance and to businesses that are registered for the Federal Government JobKeeper payment scheme for the 2020/21 year. No interest will be charged on overdue rates during 2020/21 and rates can also be deferred for payment until 30 June 2021, and payment arrangements are available.

DVCA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - POSTPONEMENT

The DVCA Annual General Meeting has now been postponed, due to the Corona virus lockdown and a future date for this meeting will be advised.

Despite living with the restrictions of Melbourne's second Corona virus lockdown, DVCA members continue working on current Dingley Village issues for the improvement of our village. We hope everyone continues to stay safe and healthy during this time.

FINALISED "PLANNING GUIDELINES FOR THE CONVERSION OF GOLF COURSE LAND TO OTHER PURPOSES" - IMPLICATIONS FOR KINGSWOOD GOLF COURSE

The State Government has now released the finalised Planning Guidelines for the Conversion of Golf Course Land to Other Purposes, to apply to both Melbourne metropolitan and regional golf courses.

These guidelines, to be implemented by a 5-member Golf Course Redevelopment Standing Advisory

Committee, are to be used for proposals for planning scheme amendments (rezoning) and development planning permit applications.

Various criteria are listed in the guidelines for use in assessing development proposals, including the requirement that the development proposal delivers a "net community benefit".

How Does This Impact Kingswood Golf Course?

These guidelines and the appointment of this Committee impact directly on Kingswood Golf Course and Dingley Village, as any future residential redevelopment proposals made to rezone Kingswood Golf Course from Special Use Golf Course could be referred to this Committee by the Minister for Planning for their assessment for approval under the guidelines.

Australian Super, as owner of Kingswood Golf Course, on release of the guidelines, has announced it will be considering these finalised guidelines as it determines the most appropriate way to proceed with plans for the Kingswood Golf Course.

Save Kingswood Golf Course Inc Secretary Kevin Poulter said he hoped the Committee and Planning Minister would take into account the massive number 8000+ objections received when Kingston Council voted unanimously against rezoning the Kingswood Golf Course for housing in 2018.

Why did the Community fight so hard to keep Kingswood Golf Course?

There is no nett benefit to Dingley Village from rezoning and redeveloping Kingswood Golf Course. Since the sale of the golf course in 2014, the community has protested long and hard against development of the golf course that would cause:

- loss of our precious and increasingly scarce open space, bushland, trees and wildlife in the heart of Dingley Village.
- placing of further strain on our infrastructure; school overcrowding, road and traffic congestion, etc.

"Kingswood is the lungs and wildlife of Dingley Village and we have gone to considerable effort to ensure it would never be residential."

It is with a touch of sadness that we tell you that due to membership numbers reaching a state that makes the club unviable the Rotary Club of Dingley Village has ceased to operate in its own right.

The club commenced life on 14 October 1978 and can be proud of its achievements during the nearly 42 years that it has served the Dingley Village and International Community. From inception when the then Past Mayor of the City of Springvale Harold Box agreed to become the Charter President the club grew from a membership of 23 to 35 and now sadly has only 9 active members. All the original members were Dingley Village residents and now of the nine members only four can call themselves Dingley Residents.

Some of the club's achievements of that period include;

- Hosted Fundraising Sportsman nights with guests including Robert de Castella, Bob Rose, Robbie Flower, John Konrads and Lou Richards to name but a few,
- Joined with neighbouring Rotary Clubs to raise money and donated an Ambulance to the then Springvale Hospital,
- Donated money to the fundraising efforts for injured local policeman Brian Stooke.
- Established two Probus Clubs in Dingley Village which are still operating and very active,
- Hosted and sponsored many Exchange students to and from countries including; USA, Finland, France, Brazil, South Africa, Japan, Hungary, Denmark, Sweden,
- Hosted and sponsored participants in Group Study Exchange programmes which also included local residents,
- Operated a food caravan at the Dingley Craft Market from 1982 until the early 2000s
- Supported all three Primary Schools and Coomoora High School with donations, Mock Interviews, Water Tanks, School Libraries and School Halls,
- Sponsored many local residents when representing the State or Australia in local and International Sporting



events. One local resident received support when representing Australia in the World Boomerang Throwing Competition in the USA.

- Provided funds for the establishment of the Abbeyfield House in Spring Rd.
- Public picnic tables in Braeside Park and Public seating in Dingley Village shopping centre
- Pride of Workmanship Awards for employees working in local businesses,
- Donations to other local sporting and service clubs including Mens Shed, Scouts, Girl Guides and View Club as well Bushfire and Flood donations to Australian Communities.
- Hosted the Great Industrial Adventure for country high school students to be introduced to vocations available to them outside of regional centres. The students were hosted for one week and billeted by local Rotary families. This programme ran from 1985 until the early 2000's. This programme received a Citation from the International Rotary President.
- Produced a District Governor from the club to lead Rotary District 9810 through 2002/03.
- Instigated the establishment of a Memorial to Veterans in Dingley Village in 2012. The club has continued to conduct commemorative services each year on ANZAC and Remembrance Day. The establishment of the memorial was financially supported by the Dingley Village Community Bendigo Bank, which continues to support all the commemorative serv-

ices and many other community projects in Dingley Village. Other supporters of the Memorial were Department of Veteran Affairs and City of Kingston. The memorial was designed and built by local resident Ben Fasham.

The Rotary Club of Dingley Village can be proud of what it has achieved over the last 42 years. But all is not lost as the club has agreed to merge with a neighbouring Rotary Club and will continue to support both local and international projects. As of 1 July 2020 Dingley Village will merge with the Rotary Club Noble Park-Keysborough and will become the Rotary Club Noble Park-Dingley. The Bendigo Bank has agreed to continue to support our local projects which will mean the continuance of the Commemorative Services each year.

On behalf of the President and all the Past Presidents we wish to thank all the businesses past and present and the Dingley Village community that have supported the club in its fundraising efforts over the years. We also thank all the past members and their partners who for whatever reason are no longer members. Without that type of support a service club such as ours cannot attempt to provide the service to the community that it does.

FOXES IN BRAESIDE PARK

Lately, foxes have captivated visitors to Braeside Park. One cub in particular seems completely at ease with humans, and has allowed many visitors to photograph it. (There are a large number of photographs on Braeside Park Friends' Facebook page.).

The European Red Fox was introduced to Victoria for hunting in 1855 and then spread north and west. Foxes spread most rapidly across the inland saltbush and Mallee country; more slowly in forested ranges. Foxes in Australia are linked to the spread of the European rabbit; also assisted by their introduction to new areas. Red foxes are now found across 76% of the continent.

Foxes are Australia's number-one predator: a primary cause in the decline and extinction of many small and medium-sized species. Foxes also prey on many bird species. Of the species listed as threatened under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act, foxes are a threat to 14 species of birds, 48 mammals, 12 reptiles and 2 amphibians.

Foxes also threaten livestock as they prey on poultry, lambs and kids. In high-



density areas, they may also be a health risk to humans and pets through diseases such as distemper, parvovirus and mange.

The total annual cost of foxes to Australia is estimated to be up to \$277 million.

The main social impacts of red foxes are not direct, but economic and environmental. However, some can occur. Examples include psychological distress

caused by fox predation on household pets, poultry and livestock, and trauma from vehicle accidents. Intra-community conflicts may happen when urban dwellers admire the Red Fox while farmers hate the carnage inflicted.

In Braeside Park, there are no native predators such as quolls and dingoes. Foxes are the top predator feeding on the introduced pest, the European rabbit. Quolls in Victoria disappeared with the arrival of cats and foxes. Dingoes disappeared with the arrival of dogs and humans. In Tasmania, the Spotted Quoll survived due to the absence of foxes, but sightings that are more recent have initiated a major fox eradication program.

Parks Victoria have eradication programs for both foxes and rabbits in Braeside Park with little long-term success. These are very expensive and require years.

So, while visitors admire the handsome Red Fox - just remember, it is in the wrong place.

DINGLEY VILLAGE CRIME REPORT (KNS 33) JUNE 2020

The good news for June 2020 is that there have been NO reported crimes in the Dingley KNS 33 area! Well done Neighbourhood Watchers – Keep up the great work and keep looking out for your neighbourhood.

However, there was one reported crime nearby in Timms Crescent (between Sandleford Drive and Howard Road):

TIMMS CRESCENT – Theft from Car – overnight 5/6/20 - The victim left his car unlocked in his driveway overnight. His wallet in the console was stolen from the car. No CCTV cameras or witnesses. No fingerprints found.

With more people being present in their homes these days, the rate of home invasions (burglaries) has decreased significantly, which is great – However an emerging trend is that "unoccupied homes" such as those listed for sale or homes under construction are now being targeted instead. If you live near a vacant home, please keep an eye on it and call 000 immediately if you see any suspicious persons or vehicles approaching it.

This is a timely reminder that the battle against crime never stops! Opportunistic criminals trawl the streets day and night (often on bicycles, or in cars with false number plates) actively trying doorhandles and looking into car windows for easy valuables left on display that are worth stealing. Please always lock your vehicle, remove all valuables out of it and immediately report any suspicious activity to 000. Ensure your house doors, garage and shed doors and side gates are locked at all times. Valuables in front yards are also being targeted, as criminals become more desperate.



If you experience theft from, or damage to your property, you can make a report to the Police Assistance Line by calling 131444. You can also report crime online to: www.police.vic.gov.au.

In addition, we continue to see home break-ins (burglaries) at residences where expensive high-end luxury cars are visible outside the address. These expensive cars are very desirable to criminals, who will often break in to homes at night in order to get the car keys and steal the car. Alarmingly, entry to many of these homes is through unlocked back or front doors, or by using the garage remote control found in another unlocked car outside the address. Please store your luxury vehicles

inside a locked garage at night (out of sight) and ensure ALL of your external doors and windows are locked. Do NOT leave garage remote controls or valuables on display inside any cars overnight.

- Meet one of the following two income
- \$125,000 per annum for an individual applicant based on your 2018-19 tax return or later; or
- \$200,000 per annum for a couple based on both 2018-19 tax returns or
- You enter into a building contract between 4 June 2020 and 31 December 2020 to either:
- Build a new home as a principal place of residence, where the property value does not exceed \$750,000; or
- Substantially renovate your existing home as a principal place of residence, where the renovation contract is between \$150,000 and \$750,000, and where the value of your existing property does not exceed \$1.5 million;
- Construction must commence within three months of the contract date.

Each state and territory has to sign a partnership agreement with the federal government. We'll be keeping a close eye on which states sign on and when. Once signed on, the state/territory will backdate acceptance of these applications to 4 June, 2020.

The other key caveat is these grants are not available for investment properties or owner-builders.

ENSURING YOUR VOICE IS HEARD

When you're here to supervise your worldly affairs, your voice, which reflects your current views, is heard, and more often than not, heeded. But when you're not here, what voice will be heard? Will it be your most recent voice; an old voice from several years ago; or the voice of government legislation? Unfortunately, all too often, it is voice number two, or worse, three.

If your will and other estate arrangements have not recently been reviewed, you risk your voice not being heard. If you have overlooked making a will, the government decides how your estate is to be distributed. This reinforces the importance of keeping all of your estate arrangements current.

That said, even with the best of intentions the most up-to-date will in the world can be challenged. There have been countless real-life court dramas involving high profile public figures engaging in claims and counter-claims following the death of a wealthy relative. Some of us have experienced similar emotional intensity, anguish, and even bitterness. We must always remember that people change, form new relationships, and take advice from different sources whose motives may not always be pure.

In ensuring your voice from the other side will be heard and heeded, the will remains the centrepiece of estate planning, but with life insurance and binding nominations for superannuation, there are additional tools you may not have thought of.

The insurance option

A policy taken out by a person on their own life and owned by that person forms part of their estate to be distributed in accordance with their will, and thus subject to challenge. But, and here is the feature which can make insurance such an important part of sound estate planning. A policy which nominates someone other than the life insured as the beneficiary does not form part of the estate and is quite separate from the will - and not subject to challenge.

What this means is that if there is even the smallest possibility that your wishes

may not be carried out after you're gone, it might be a good idea to seek professional advice about the value of a life insurance policy.

The super solution

It is widely believed that superannuation is included in an estate and dealt with through a will; not so. The trustee of your superannuation fund determines how your super is paid upon your death. You may identify a "preferred beneficiary" however the fund trustee can override this decision at its discretion. If you don't want this to occur, you should complete a 'Binding Death Benefit Nomination'.

Binding Death Benefit Nominations

Superannuation legislation allows you to specifically nominate, with certainty, who will receive your super following your death.

These nominations must be in writing and clearly state the names of beneficiaries and any split details between multi-beneficiaries. Some funds offer non-lapsing binding nominations however, many binding nominations must be renewed every three years and are only valid if you nominate a dependant, e.g. your current spouse (including de facto), or your child of any age, or a person financially dependent upon you at the time of death. You may also nominate your estate.

Binding nominations are still relevant if you have a self-managed super fund. Even though you have the final decision on how your super is managed whilst you are alive, it is crucial to ensure your trustee/s (who may also be family) continues to fulfil your wishes after you die.

To ensure it's your own voice that takes final control of what you have worked hard for in this lifetime, consult an estate planning specialist or talk to your financial adviser.

HOW IS COMPUTER VISION SYNDROME. OR DIGITAL EYE STRAIN TREATED?

Solutions to digital screen-related vision problems are varied. However, they can usually be alleviated by obtaining regular eye care and making changes in how you view the screen.

In some cases, individuals who do not require the use of eyeglasses for other daily activities may benefit from glasses prescribed specifically for computer use. In addition, persons already wearing glasses may find their current prescription does not provide optimal vision for viewing a computer. Lenses prescribed to meet the unique visual demands of computer viewing may be needed. Special lens designs made specifically for computer use, lens prescriptions tailored for the computer or office environment, or lens tints and coatings such as an anti-reflective coating or blue protective coating that filters out the blue light from screens, may help to maximize visual abilities and comfort.

Some computer users experience problems with eye focusing or eye coordination that cannot be adequately corrected with eyeglasses or contact lenses. A program of vision therapy may be needed to treat these specific problems. Vision therapy is a structured program of visual activities prescribed to improve visual abilities. Think of it as physiotherapy for eyes. It trains the eyes and brain to work together more efficiently and effectively. These eye exercises help remediate deficiencies in eye movement, eye focusing, eye teaming, and reinforce the eye-brain connection. Treatment may include office-based as well as home training procedures.

1. Viewing the Computer:

- Proper body positioning and alignment of head, neck and back for computer use will help. Some important factors in preventing or reducing the symptoms of Digital Eye Strain have to do with the computer and how it is used. This includes lighting conditions, chair comfort, location of reference materials, position of the monitor, and the use of rest breaks.
- Most people find it more comfortable to view a computer when the eyes are looking downward. Optimally, the computer screen should be 15 to 20 degrees below eye level as measured from the centre of the screen and 500 to 700 mm from the eyes. Reference materials should be located above the keyboard and below the monitor. If this is not possible, a document holder can be used beside the monitor. The goal is to position the documents so you do not need to move your head to look from the document to the screen.

2. Lighting - Position the computer screen to avoid glare, particularly from overhead lighting or windows. Use blinds or drapes on windows and replace the light bulbs in desk lamps with bulbs of lower wattage to reduce glare.

- 3. Anti-glare screens If there is no way to minimize glare from light sources, consider using a screen glare filter. These filters decrease the amount of light reflected from the screen.
- 4. Seating position Chairs should be comfortably padded and conform to the body. Chair height should be adjusted so your feet rest flat on the floor. If your chair has arms, they should be adjusted to provide arm support while you are typing. Your wrists shouldn't rest on the keyboard when typing.
- 5. Rest breaks To prevent eye strain, try to rest your eyes when using the computer for long periods. For every 20 minutes of computer viewing, look into the distance for 20 seconds to allow your eyes a chance to refocus.
- **6. Blinking** To minimize your chances of developing dry eye when using a computer, make an effort to blink frequently. Blinking keeps the front surface of your eyes moist and therefore more comfortable.



We were excited last year to be able to purchase a near new van. We were given a grant of \$5000 to kick start off our appeal. Over a few months we were able to gain support from several others including businesses, church members and the church. Prior to this we had always had older vans. Because of having to pick up food; a reliable van is vital to our work.

The team at Emergency Resources feel blessed that we can make a difference to people's lives.
