NEW KINGSTON COUNCIL ANNOUNCED

Results for the 2020 Kingston Council elections have been declared by the Victorian Electoral Commission, with five councillors re-elected and six new faces joining the expanded 11-member Council.

Following the introduction of the Local Government Act 2020, a new ward system came into effect with the City of Kingston's three wards, North, Central and South Wards, replaced with 11 single-member wards.

The Victorian Electoral Commission, which conducted the elections, officially declared the results at 9.30am on Wednesday 11 November.

The successful candidates were: Banksia ward – Cameron Howe Bunjil ward – Steve Staikos Caruana ward – George Hua Chicquita ward – Tracey Davies Como ward – Chris Hill Karkarook ward – Hadi Saab Longbeach ward – Georgina Oxley Melaleuca ward – Tim Cochrane Sandpiper ward – David Eden Wattle ward – Jenna Davey-Burns Yammerbook ward – Tamsin Bearsley

City of Kingston CEO Julie Reid congratulated the newly-elected Councillors.

"I want to welcome our new Councillors and congratulate those who have been re-elected to Council," said Ms Reid. "I'm looking forward to working with all of them to do great things for Kingston over the next 4 years."

The new Kingston Council will serve the community for a four-year term until October 2024.

The Councillors were to be sworn in at a Council meeting on Wednesday 18 November at 7.00pm.

DVCA SUBMISSION TO SENATE INQUIRY INTO GENERAL AVIATION INDUSTRY

A Senate inquiry into the current state of Australia's general aviation industry is currently underway. As an opportunity to effect meaningful change to general aviation and the issues affecting our community related to aircraft noise, DVCA has made a detailed submission to the Inquiry.

DVCA's submission highlights the social impact that continuous circuit training activities have on the amenities of communities that live in close proximity to general aviation airports in Australia.

Our submission details the noise issues related to continuous circuit training activity at general aviation airports, such as Moorabbin Airport, with training planes flying the same path directly over people's homes who are under the flight paths, on a non-stop basis during the day and into the evenings.

The DVCA submission also includes recommendations to address the noise, safety and environmental issues connected with continuous circuit training activities at urban general aviation airports.

LIFE AFTER LOCKDOWN: FREEDOM AT LAST

Well, the year 2020 has been a year unlike any other. As optometrists, we were all very excited to be ushering in the year 2020, as the term commonly describes "good normal vision." We have had anything but "normal" this year. And as we emerge from lockdown and start to embrace a new COVID normal, we want to reflect a little on what life during COVID has meant for our eyes.

It has meant, more indoor time, more screen time, more time spent on near tasks and less exercise. Our kids have been hit the hardest, no junior sport, dance or hobbies and activities that they love. School time has been spent staring at screens, and then down time has meant either reading to relax or more screen time playing games. This, unfortunately, has taken its toll and as most of us can attest to, more screen time has meant more strain, fatigue, tired eyes and even headaches.

What this means for the younger eyes, is increased risk factors of shortsightedness (myopia), where seeing in the distance becomes more blurry. But blurry vision in the distance is only one part of the story, as myopic eyes mean longer eyeballs. Longer eyeballs tend to lead to increased risks of further eye diseases in adult life.

Increased near tasks, less outdoor time and low levels of light exposure are all known factors that contribute to send messages to the eye to continue stretching out and making the retina (back of the eye) thinner. This is abnormal growth of the eye, which is what we want to try and avoid.

Fortunately, we now have some amazing treatments available to counteract the "abnormal" growth of the eye. And aside from regular checkups to monitor the growth of the eye and vision, some simple lifestyle changes such as spending at least two hours of time outside every day will help, having good lighting while reading or even something as simple as the 20/20 rule: Which is having a break from near tasks every 20 minutes and looking at something far away for 20 seconds, can all help. So the take home message is now that we are allowed out more and



A DIFFERENT WAY TO HELP THE GRANDKIDS

Many grandparents want to give their grandchildren a head start in life, and a common way to do so is to help by paying some (or all) of their school fees. This can, of course, simply be done by making a contribution at the time the fees are payable. However, it's not unusual for grandparents to plan ahead by setting funds aside in a specific account. That is one option, but there might be a better one.

Plan A

Donna and Simon are a typical example. They decide to put \$50,000 into a term deposit to help pay the school fees of their granddaughter Ellie when she starts secondary school in 10 years' time. With an interest rate of 2.6% per annum (pa) and interest paid annually, their initial deposit will grow to \$64,631 – a nice boost to Ellie's future education.

But is there a better way to use that \$50,000?

While it's nice to have a specific account with its special status and easy to see growth, the important thing is the overall pool of money available to the family when the time comes to stump up the school fees.

Plan B

Ellie's parents, Sara and Shane, are five years into paying off their mortgage. Their interest rate is 5% pa, the remaining balance is \$530,000, and their monthly repayments are \$3,500. If interest rates and payments remain steady, in 10 years' time their mortgage balance will be down to around \$329,427.

What if, instead of setting up the term deposit, Donna and Simon gift the \$50,000 to Sara and Shane who then deposit it in their mortgage account? This sees them effectively servicing a smaller loan. Maintaining their usual monthly repayments will now reduce the amount they owe on their mortgage in 10 years to approximately \$247,077, giving them more equity in their home to draw on for school fees.

Difference

Plan A turned \$50,000 into \$64,631, a net benefit of \$14,631. But plan B more than doubled that benefit to \$32,350!

Of course, Donna and Simon will need to feel confident that they can trust Sara and Shane to use the gift in the way they intend, and not to redraw it for holidays or other purposes. And if they are receiving any age pension, or intending to apply for one in the next five years, Donna and Simon will also need to be aware of the gifting rules and how this gift could impact their pension payments.

Get advice first

This is just one example of how intergenerational planning can significantly grow the wealth of the extended family unit.
