HALL AND LIBRARY TO REOPEN

After a year of relocation or closure, works are finally coming to an end and Dingley Village residents will have a beautiful modern facility. Residents were able to have a sneak peek during the Farmers' Market on the 15th February with staff from City of Kingston and the Neighbourhood Centre on site to provide tours and answer questions.

The refurbished facility has been designed to flow and extend outdoors and will include indoor, outdoor library space, which also flows into the large fover where comfortable furniture will encourage residents to sit and relax whilst reading or using free data and Wi-Fi. The new Art space fills with light during the day due to the multiple walls of glass which fold back opening up the space and also the foyer to the extensive decking. The Harold Box Hall has not been forgotten, and is unrecognisable as the old red brick hall. The Parquetry floor has been restored, the hall can be divided into smaller spaces, plus new modern kitchen will make catering for functions and events a lot easier.

City of Kingston are to be congratulated on providing a beautiful community space and the Dingley Dossier encourages residents to utilise these facilities, especially the library.

If you missed out on getting a sneak peek, the hall will again be open, but no guided tours, during the Farmers' Market on the 21st March. Neighbourhood Centre activities will commence late February with library opening in late March.

ALL WEATHER OUTDOOR BASKETBALL COURT NEEDED

Dingley Village needs a new outdoor basketball court or courts. During the redevelopment of the hall and library, the basketball court in the Marcus Rd was often used for parking and with increased usage of new library and hall expected, cars will continue to park on the court.

The current basketball court is not fit for purpose, the surface is uneven

and breaking up meaning players are at risk of injury, the surface also damages basketballs. After feedback from adults, adolescents and children using the current court, the Board of the Dingley Village Neighbourhood Centre hope to join with the Community Association to lobby City of Kingston to build one or two outdoor basketball courts on the Spring Road Reserve.

KINGSTON ANNOUNCES A FUNDING PACKAGE TO HELP BUSHFIRE RECOVERY PROJECTS

Kingston Council has announced a range of initiatives and funding commitments to help support recovery projects around the State following the recent devastating bushfires.

Included in the assistance package will be a one-off \$50,000 allocation to a recovery project in one of the affected shires and a donation to be shared equally between Wildlife Victoria and Zoos Victoria from the proceeds of the Mordialloc Festival gold coin entry and the Bushfire Fundraiser Wine Sales at the Kingston Arts' Pop Up Bar.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley expressed Council's sympathy to the people and communities who suffered losses from the bushfires and said the Kingston community want to do whatever they can to support the affected people in the long recovery process.

"The absolute generosity of our community and the way everyone has come together has been incredible to see," Cr Oxley said. "Local businesses have been donating whatever they can, thousands of dollars' worth of food and other products, and sending them out to communities in need."

The City of Kingston also promised to continue to make staff available to assist affected Councils throughout Victoria.

"We will continue to do whatever we can to help those communities recovering from the devastating bushfires including other local councils who need our support to deliver vital services to their residents," said Cr Oxley.

Council's bushfire recovery initiatives include:

- Allocate \$50,000 to a recovery project to be determined in consultation with the Shire of Towong
- Donate the proceeds of the 2020 Mordialloc Festival gold coin entry and the proceeds from the Bushfire Fundraiser Wine Sales at Kingston Arts' Pop Up Bar to Wildlife Victoria (Victorian Bushfire Appeal) and Zoos Victoria (Bushfire Emergency Wildlife Fund)
- Waive Council facility hire fees for bushfire fundraising efforts by community groups to 30 June 2020

MORDIALLOC ALCOHOL-FREE ZONE TO BE EXTENDED TO 24 HOURS

Kingston Council have introduced a 24hour alcohol-free zone in the Mordialloc foreshore area to ensure the popular precinct remains a safe environment for the whole community all year round.

The decision to extend the current alcohol-free ban follows a request from Victoria Police to consider a year-round 24-hour ban to assist officers in tackling an increase in alcohol-related anti-social behaviour in Mordialloc.

Kingston Council sought community feedback to the proposal before voting to approve the changes to the alcohol-free zone at its January meeting.

SPRING ROAD RESERVE DEVELOPMENTS - PLANTING PLAN

The improvements continue at the Spring Road Reserve, with a draft Planting Plan now prepared by AECOM, to be implemented by Council in association with the DVCA.

Spring Road Reserve, designated by Council as a recreational park, when fully developed will comprise; open space, walking and cycling paths, a dog exercise area, shelters /seating and car parking.

As the park is a former tip site, with a cap soil covering, no deep rooted vegetation (trees with tap roots) will be planted in the park to protect the soil cap integrity. Local indigenous plant species common to the Gippsland Plain Damp Sand Rich Woodland and other native plant species have been carefully identified in the Plan to suit the park site, providing border screening and plantings throughout the park.

Over the next year, in accordance with the Plan, Council would commence to establish vegetation plantings in the park, with soil preparation, mulching and the planting of native species to be undertaken.

KINGSWOOD GOLF COURSE PARK UPDATE

The Planning Minister has set up a Golf Course Advisory Committee to consider applications for development proposals on Golf Courses. We expect Kingswood Golf Course will be considered in the first quarter of 2020. Given Kingswood is not zoned residential and 97 percent of respondents are against re-zoning,



we anticipate a good result. We will however make a very strong presentation for Dingley Village if the matter appears before Council or the Victorian Planning Department.

ROWAN ROAD / WESTALL ROAD INTERSECTION -DRIVING SAFETY ISSUE

Detector loops were installed by VicRoads in 2017 on Rowan Rd and in the median opening on Westall Rd. The detector loops were installed following a number of accidents and fatalities at this intersection.

Detectors are wire loops located just under the road surface, which sense the metal in vehicles. When vehicles stop at the Rowan Rd intersection, these detector loops / sensors trigger the pedestrian crossing lights at the intersection and stop traffic. This provides motorists with time for safer turning movements into and out of Rowan Road, which is an important access road for Dingley Village.

However there is a short wait time before the crossing lights are triggered by the vehicle sensor detectors - IT IS NOT INSTANTANEOUS.

It is important to be patient when using this intersection and wait until the crossing lights have been triggered and enter this intersection safely and with care. Please remember this intersection has been extremely dangerous with 10 crashes and 2 fatalities occurring here between 2011 and 2016.

RETIRE AT 65 BUT DON'T RETIRE YOUR MONEY

Australian retirees are facing a 'double whammy' when it comes to funding their retirement. On the one hand we, as a nation, are enjoying longer and healthier lives. On the other hand, record low interest rates have slashed the returns on the traditional bedrocks of post-retirement investment portfolios such as term deposits, cash management accounts and annuities. *Let's take a look at Dave and Linda...*

A dilemma

This is the dilemma facing Dave and Linda. On the point of retirement these fit and active 65 year olds are looking forward to regular overseas travel while maintaining their comfortable lifestyle. They estimate this will cost them \$80,000 per year, to be funded from their combined retirement savings of \$1 million. Both are in good health, and realise there's a high likelihood that one or both of them could live well into their 90s.

Naturally, Dave and Linda's first thought is about security and capital preservation. This leads them to look at investing their funds in a portfolio mainly comprising income-producing investments that will spare them from the volatility of share and property markets. However they quickly discover that, with interest rates so low, it will be difficult to achieve a return of just 3% per annum.

A simple financial calculation shows that if they draw \$80,000 each year from a portfolio with this low rate of return, the money will run out in just under 16 years. This strategy will see them barely make it into their 80s.

Time for a rethink

This highlights to Dave and Linda that longevity risk is as much of a threat as investment risk. To address the risk of outliving their money, Dave and Linda consider a portfolio that, while retaining some conservative investments, apportions most of their funds to a well-diversified range of growth assets including property, Australian and international shares, and some higher-yielding income funds. With an estimated return of 7% p.a., Dave and Linda's money is calculated to last just over 30 years, seeing them well into their 90s.

Balancing the risks

Yes, a growth portfolio is, from an investment point of view, higher risk than a defensive or conservative portfolio. That is, it will be more volatile, rising and falling in value along with investment markets. Dave and Linda will need to accept this volatility if they want to meet their lifestyle goals. However, even 10 years is a long investment horizon, let alone 30, so with time on their side they should be able to ride out any market downturns.

And there's another safety net. The above calculations ignore any age pension. As Dave and Linda draw down on their savings they will probably qualify for some age pension. Not only will this offset some of the investment risk, it will substantially extend the date when their savings will eventually be exhausted.

Helpful advice

Establishing a well diversified, considered portfolio is a little more complex than setting up a conservative portfolio. It will also require more active monitoring and regular review. On top of that individual circumstances can change quickly, particularly in older age.

There are different classes of anti-anxiety medication which may affect vision and eye health. One of the most commonly prescribed classes of antidepressants are the selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs). Side effects of this medication include dry eyes and disruption of our focusing system, affecting our clarity and/ or comfort with reading, computer work and delayed focus when viewing different distances. There are suggestions that prolonged use can be associated with altered blood flow to the nerve that connects the eye to the brain. Studies indicate a greater risk of glaucoma (a condition affecting your peripheral vision) with SSRI medications, particularly in individuals on stronger doses or longer duration of use.

2. Blood Pressure medications

High or low blood pressure can affect eye health. When taking blood pressure medications, there are some that have been linked with glaucoma (particularly diuretics and calcium channel blockers). Our optometrists check for glaucoma through the use of OCT (ocular coherence tomography) 3D eye scans, measurement of your eye pressure, automated perimetry and more.

3. Amiodarone (heart medications)

This medication often prescribed for an irregular heart beat can cause multiple eye changes including a whorl-like pattern on the cornea and it has also been linked with a risk of lack of blood flow to the optic nerve.

4. Hydroxychloroquine (Plaquenil)

Plaquenil can be prescribed for rheumatic disease and was long term prescribed as an antimalarial medication. Research shows that even in low doses it can be toxic to the retina. It is important that anyone on this medication has their eye health checked regularly to assess for any changes, particularly at the macula which is used for central vision; OCT is especially useful in this regard.

5. Accutane/Roaccutane (Acne Medication)

Often prescribed in adolescence and early adulthood, this medication has been shown to cause a variety of ocular side effects. Fortunately, most of these side-effects are temporary. There are a few reports of decreased dark adaptation problems, cataract development in young adults and persistent dry eye for over 2 years after discontinuing the medication.

6. Erectile Dysfunction Medications

Sildenfail citrate (Viagra) is a medication that causes a change in blood flow away from the heart. Potential side effects include lack of blood flow to the eye, changes in eye pressure and risk of glaucoma and risk of "blue vision" as the medications disrupt neurotransmission within the retina. Dilated eye examinations with OCT scans and retinal photography are important in assessing these medication-related changes to the retina.

7. Herbal

Herbal supplements are quite common and just like prescription medications, they can cause side effects depending on the supplement and dosage. Gingko biloba, Fish oil and flaxseed oil are natural blood thinners, and thus may interact with other conditions and cause longer bleeding times to the eyes and body.

If you take any medications and are unsure if they may be affecting your eyes or your vision, please let your optometrist know.

GUESS WHAT THE MEDIAN HOUSE PRICE WAS IN 1980?

All fishermen have a story about "The one that got away.."

I think all property owners are the same!
