# NATIONAL STROKE WEEK AUGUST 2-8 AUGUST

Stroke attacks the brain - the human control centre - changing lives in an instant. Stroke is a medical emergency.

If you or someone else shows the signs of stroke, **call 000 immediately**.

Your brain is fed by blood carrying oxygen and nutrients through blood vessels called arteries. A stroke happens when blood cannot get to your brain, because of a blocked or burst artery. As a result, your brain cells die due to a lack of oxygen and nutrients.

- An estimated 27,428 Australians experienced stroke for the first time in their lives in 2020, and there were an estimated 445,087 survivors of stroke living in the community.
- Stroke is one of Australia's biggest killers. It kills more women than breast cancer and more men than prostate cancer.
- The economic cost of stroke exceeded \$6.2 billion, with a further \$26.0 billion in lost wellbeing -due to short and long-term disability, and premature death.
- Reducing uncontrolled high-blood pressure and improving access to stroke treatment and care could mean thousands of Australians avoiding stroke, surviving and living well after stroke. More than 80 percent of strokes can be prevented.

• When a stroke strikes, it attacks up to 1.9 million brain cells per minute.

How do you know if someone is having a stroke? Think... F.A.S.T.

The Stroke Foundation recommends the F.A.S.T. test as an easy way to remember the most common signs of stroke. Using the F.A.S.T. test involves asking these simple questions:

- 1. Face: Check their face. Has their mouth drooped?
- 2. Arms: Can they lift both arms?
- 3. Speech: Is their speech slurred? Do they understand you?
- 4. Time: Is critical. If you see any of these signs **call 000** straight away.

There are some stroke risk factors that you cannot do anything about, such as

older age, being male, family history or already having a prior stroke. But for most Australians, you can reduce your risk and help prevent stroke by taking some simple steps:

- Make time for a health check for stroke risk factors.
- Take charge of your own health and live a healthy lifestyle.

# Kingston unveils a new Community Vision developed by the community

Kingston Council has been presented with its new Community Vision with a focus on building the most liveable and sustainable city in Victoria. Developed by a representative community panel with feedback from many thousands more who live and work in Kingston, the vision sets out the long-term aspirations of our community and provides a set of principles to guide Council decision making to ensure that vision stays on track.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said he was proud to receive the new Community Vision that would help guide Council as it strives to build a Kingston that meets the needs and aspirations of the community into the future.

"The new vision has been developed through the dedication and hard work of the Your Kingston Your Future Community Panel who were empowered to create this important piece of work," said Cr Staikos.

"The panel spent more than 2000 hours developing the vision and recommendations for our strategic plans that will ensure Kingston is the best place to live, work and play now and into the future."

The Community Vision focuses on inclusiveness, diversity, resilience, protecting our natural environment, thriving businesses and embracing innovation. "These are all key ingredients to help build Kingston into the most liveable and sustainable city we can be,"

### Cr Staikos said.

The Your Kingston Your Future Community Panel developed our Community Vision statement:

- Kingston is a resilient, inclusive and diverse community. We are building the most liveable and sustainable city in Victoria.
- We champion and nurture our green and open spaces creating a safe, healthy environment.
- Our shared legacy connects our community, embracing innovation, making Kingston the place to live.

The panel also developed a series of recommendations for Council's strategic plans. Those recommendations are being used to draft the four-year Council Plan, Public Health and Wellbeing Plan and 10-year plans for how we manage the city's finances and assets.

The community will have another chance to provide input on those plans in late August with the final strategic plans expected to be considered by Council at the October Council meeting (excluding the Asset Management Plan which will be considered in 2022).

"What is exciting about our new Community Vision is that although Council has always engaged with the community when developing our Council Vision and guiding plans, this is the first time a representative community panel has been given the power to develop their own vision with Council committing to adopt it with no changes,"

said Cr Staikos.

"All our panelists told us they felt the process was 'collaborative, genuine and worthwhile' with most saying they were much more likely to participate in projects like this in the future now."

# Council flags strong concerns over development at Moorabbin Airport site

Future plans for Moorabbin Airport put the future of aviation at risk and increase safety concerns.

Council and the community fear that the proposed draft master plan for the Moorabbin Airport site includes too much non-aviation development that: imposes on neighbouring homes; could compromise safety; and undermines the site's prime purpose as a centre for aviation.

Kingston Council will flag these issues directly with the Federal Government and lodge a submission objecting to key elements of the Moorabbin Airport Preliminary Draft 2021 Master Plan.

Under the draft master plan, which is currently advertised for public comment, large areas of airport land once used for aviation purposes, have been identified for large industrial/ commercial uses not related to the aviation industry. Moorabbin Airport, located in Melbourne's south-east just 25km from the CBD, is Australia's second busiest airport averaging 295,000 movements per year.

Mayor Steve Staikos said he would call on Federal Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development, The Hon Barnaby Joyce to reject the Master Plan until more space is set aside to future proof existing and future aviation activities; buffer zones are added between warehouses/ industrial buildings and neighbouring homes; and all references to the airport being located inside the Urban Growth Boundary are corrected.

"Development at Moorabbin Airport should be aviation related and not come at the expense of neighbouring residents or if it puts aviation safety at risk. Buildings should be located away from homes and should leave plenty of open space for emergency landings,"

## Cr Staikos said.

Chicquita Ward Councillor Tracey Davies said the Moorabbin Airport Corporation (MAC) needs to go back to the drawing board.

"The MAC needs to listen to the aviation tenants, and to their neighbours in the streets surrounding the airport, and make the changes we have outlined in Council's submission.

The Airport needs to scrap the plans for even more large big-box development, respect the amenity of neighbouring residents, and provide adequate space for aviation activities at Moorabbin Airport,"

Cr Davies said.

Concerns raised in Council's submission include:

- Insufficient land set aside for the Airport's core aviation role and non-aviation uses prioritised over aviation support services.
- Unconstrained retail, industrial and commercial development on the airport land poses a risk to other activity centres across Kingston.

- Location of proposed industrial and warehouse buildings along sensitive 
  interfaces including neighbouring established homes with no urban
  design guidance or performance measures to manage the amenity impact
  on adjoining residents.
- The loss of green open spaces and the extent to which this exacerbates existing urban heat island issues associated with the airport.
- Airport safety, noise and the extent of development proposed immediately adjacent existing runways generates issues for pilots associated with windshear.

# National Firearms Amnesty

If you have an unregistered or unwanted firearm, this is an opportunity to hand it in with no penalty.

The Amnesty indemnifies anyone from prosecution who is surrendering an unlawful possession of a firearm, firearm parts and ammunition.

The Australian Government has partnered with Crime Stoppers Australia to launch a permanent national firearms amnesty to keep Australians safe while ensuring those with a legitimate need to access firearms are able to do so.

People who have an unregistered firearm or firearm-related item will be able to surrender it to a police station anonymously and without penalty, for registration, sale or destruction.

In Victoria firearms can be surrendered at licensed firearm dealers if you would prefer not to go to a police station. No questions asked.

An unwanted firearm may also be handed in at anytime.

## How have we got to this point? Why do we have to object again?

The previous inappropriate residential development proposal submitted to Kingston Council was abandoned in 2018 due to the overwhelming pressure of 8,000 + objections.

In August 2019 the Andrews Labour Government changed the planning rules for golf course redevelopment proposals by creating a Golf Course Redevelopment Standing Advisory Committee. This allowed Australian Super to submit a new proposal to the State Planning Minister in November 2020 and after 6 months the Minister referred it to the Committee in May 2021. At the end of June 2021, the Committee released the details of the new proposal, allowing 6 weeks for public review and comment.

YOUR OBJECTIONS ARE BEING MADE TO THIS COMMITTEE, it has nothing to do with Kingston Council. The Committee will then provide recommendations, including a draft planning permit, to the Minister on the proposal for the rezoning and redevelopment of Kingswood Golf Course (Draft Amendment C199). Following this the Minister will consider these recommendations using his powers to make a decision.

# Save Kingswood!

It has been suggested to us by a few we should negotiate about Kingswood. But AustralianSuper have not reached out to us, nor listened to any input from residents.

Only weeks ago I wrote again to their CEO Ian Silk, suggesting we meet, but he just replied with their Spin doctor's propaganda that they had consulted residents.

The DVCA would like to know when, as the whole time Leigh has been Chairman, he has not had any contact from them. Many times when residents provided feedback, it has been used against them. I have ample proof of that.

They hide their plans for years then suddenly burst on the scene, giving us just a month to object - or comment. Don't believe everything you read. ISPT, their contractor, said in the media "There will be no multistorey buildings on Kingswood."

At that time there were HUNDREDS of three storey buildings on their plans, just like currently there are nearly 700 three storey tiny apartments! Compare that to the Hawthorn Football Club, who have shown us plans and kept us up to date for years. Also adapted a few suggestions. Fantastic people to deal with.

I suspect if we manage to stop this current plan, AustralianSuper, the 225

Billion dollar financial bully, will be obliged to sit down and talk with us. But it would be amazing and unexpected if they could be flexible enough to think outside of their high density mass infill and staggering profits.

We have been asking residents what they would like as an alternative, but with mixed results.

The dream outcome for some would be a high school with ovals for sports, but AustralianSuper won't consider that, as they made three of the biggest real estate mistakes ever -

- Gambling with member's money by purchasing a Golf Course Park without first talking to residents and the Council to ask what would be a suitable use.
- 2. Signing a contract without a "subject to rezoning" clause
- 3. Paid double an optimistic valuation.

Now they want to destroy the entire village, make an obscene profit and bolt. Our consulting architect said:

"The whole of Dingley Village should not haveto suffer because of an inappropriate purchase by AustralianSuper."

We say - when they are ready to talk real compromise, we will be there, even if it means another trip to their ivory towers in the city. Resident's suggestions have included considerably more open space and a Retirement Village.



That would be quality Apartments of a good size, with much less traffic and no double and triple parking on nature strips and the street.

I wrote to the Planning Minister Richard Wynne over a month ago and never received a reply.

# Uncle Cliff

Everyone in the family always knew Uncle Cliff was eccentric, but he was a lot of fun. He lived on his own on the East Coast of England in a really interesting eighteen century cottage. For a while he was married to a Turkish lady who he met while on holiday many years ago. We have heard him tell the story often, how he met this lady who happened to be a vet.

He was in a cafe in Kusadasi and could not find a seat, and asked this lady sitting on her own if he could share her table and of course she said yes. From that brief encounter he ended up marrying that lady. They lived in a small village in England - she practiced as a vet and he taught physics at a boy's grammar school a few miles away. The marriage lasted about five years - they did not have any children and she subsequently went back to Turkey.

Martin and I were in Scotland trying to catch some trout and it rained every day. Martin is my cousin and Cliff is an uncle to us both. After visiting every distillery in Scotland we phoned Cliff and invited ourselves to go and spend some time with him. It took us a couple of days to drive down the coast from Edinburgh to Aldeburgh. We brought him a couple of single malt just to get things moving. I had stayed with Cliff a couple of years before but Martin had never been to the cottage and I was wondering how he would find the five foot doors as he was six foot three. Anyhow I had explained to Martin how different he would find things in the cottage.

The cottage is classified by the National Trust and Cliff is not allowed to change anything. There is a small spiral staircase in the middle of the small lounge room that is wrapped around a tall spar that came from an old sailing ship that was wrecked on the coast in 1775. On arrival, Martin had never seen a half door (or Dutch door) before. I told Martin they were very practical - they let the fresh air in and kept out dogs, pigs and goats. They also allowed the wives to chat to the neighbours and they had something to rest on. Cliff had made some chicken soup that he just had to warm up.

He appeared to be delighted to have some visitors and told us we were going down the harbour later to collect a couple of crayfish for dinner. He told us that night was the Harvest Moon Festival and we would be celebrating. After we picked up the crayfish from Cliff's friend, Gully.

We visited the Harbour Tavern and he recommended we have some rum and pep to warm us up. The Tavern was tiny and inside there was only room for six people and as it was dog friendly, there were a couple of them. We were outside, where there was plenty of room. On the way home Cliff said he had something special to show us. It was a garage where his Austin car was housed and we thought it must be the car. However, it was the garage where Benjamin Britten used to keep his car.

We discovered that Uncle Cliff was a really good cook and had a decent collection of French red wine and he told us he learned to cook from his Turkish wife. It was very late, after several bottles of red, when Martin and I, with great difficulty, had to navigate the spiral stairs to the bedroom. The bedroom was small and we had to share the bed. That did not bother us; however, we had to angle the bed in a way to allow for Martin's long legs sticking out the end. We had a wonderful sleep, apart from when Cliff's red cat jumped on the bed at about four o'clock in the morning. We got the impression from the cat that we were unwelcome. We stayed with Uncle Cliff for the rest of the week and thought we would continue to travel south. We had enjoyed Cliff's cooking and hospitality and Martin and I agreed that we both needed a few days to dry out.

# 30,000 New Government **Handouts for Housing**

From 1st July 2021, 30,000 new places were made available under the Australian Government's First Home Loan Deposit Scheme, the New Home Guarantee, and the Family Home Guarantee.

10,000 additional places have been released under the popular First Home Loan Deposit Scheme (FHLDS) for the 2021-2022 financial year. Unfortunately for prospective buyers it is not a cash handout, rather it replicates a parent guarantee situation with the Federal Government being guarantor instead of Mum & Dad. Which saves the LMI expense. And takes pressure off Mum and Dad.

Eligibility restrictions including the need for an initial 5% of the purchase price in 'genuine saving' and limits on purchase price apply.

Existing (old) homes are eligible, note previous releases of this scheme were snapped up quickly and we expect that to again be the case. The New Home Guarantee, first announced in October 2020, is specifically for eligible first home buyers building or buying a new home with a deposit of as little as 5 per cent.

It has been extended under the 2021-2022 Federal Budget with 10,000 new places available from 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022.

The Family Home Guarantee was announced in the 2021-2022 Federal Budget to support eligible single parents with at least one dependent child. 10,000 Family Home Guarantees will be made available over four financial years from 1 July 2021 to buy a new or existing home with a deposit of as little as 2 per cent. Note these schemes are only available through a limited number of banks, applications can be made through your broker.

We continue to encourage prospective home buyers to speak to their broker who is a qualified credit adviser to be aware of what is required to enable home ownership. Financial strategy in property purchase can be complicated and is different for every individual in a different situation. Quality advice is paramount.

# The greatest challenges facing future retirees

Most working Australians aspire to the idea that they'll reach a point where they can retire debt-free and with enough money in their superannuation fund – perhaps supplemented by the age pension – to provide them with a comfortable standard of living in retirement.
