DONATE SAFELY

Australians are renowned for their generosity when it comes to a worthy cause. But it's that very willingness to put their hands in their pocket which has led many generous Aussies to be targeted by scammers.

After the recent floods in New South Wales and Queensland, the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission urged the public to do a quick online check of any charity's credentials before donating. The ACNC regulates charities in Australia and charities must be registered with the ACNC to receive Commonwealth tax concessions.

ACNC Commissioner the Hon Dr Gary Johns said there are many legitimate charities on the ACNC Charity Register raising funds, however he said it is important to exercise caution, as there are always scammers trying to take advantage of people's goodwill.

"We are concerned to see media reports about scammers seeking to exploit the community's generosity in the wake of the floods in NSW and Queensland. It is all too common, unfortunately, for scams to spring up following disasters. Scammers pretend to represent a charity raising money to help people in need when actually they are fraudsters trying to make a buck for themselves," Dr Johns said.

"It is crucial to do a quick online check of our Charity Register before giving, to make sure your donation is going to an organisation that genuinely does good work

"While it is important to be generous to support people in need after a disaster, it is also important to give with confidence. As the regulator, the ACNC is watching over the sector to maintain confidence."

"There were 400,000 searches of the register in March, perhaps in part due to the floods. We know that there were more than 3 million searches of the Charity Register last financial year, which shows a growing awareness of how valuable a resource the register is for donors who would like to check the legitimacy of a charity before they make a donation," Dr Johns said.

The ACNC's top tips for safe giving include:

 Before giving, check a charity's credentials on the ACNC website Charity Register acnc.gov.au/charity.



- Look for established and registered charities that are running verified special appeals.
- If you get a call from someone claiming to be from a charity, ask to call them back. Search the Charity Register and call back using the phone number published there.
- If donating to a charity via a thirdparty crowdfunding campaign, be aware the charity is bound by its own rules in the way it spends donated funds, not by a third-party's promises.
- Don't click on links in unsolicited emails and social media posts. It is safer to visit a charity's website to avoid clicking a link to an imitation website
- Don't give out your credit card and bank account details on social media, and be cautious when doing so online.
- Always ask for identification from door-to-door and street fundraising collectors.

Experienced Interim CEO appointed to guide Kingston during 2021

2021. Mr Tamlin brings significant experience to the role, having served as CEO of South Gippsland Shire Council for 10 years and prior to that as Director of Engineering Services at the City of Greater Dandenong.

Kingston Mayor, Steve Staikos, said Mr Tamlin's strong leadership experience would help guide the City of Kingston, while recruitment for the ongoing CEO position took place. "We believe Mr Tamlin will provide stability to ensure we continue providing high-quality services, invest in new facilities and support our business community during COVID-recovery," Cr Staikos said.

Mr Tamlin said it was an honour to be appointed Interim CEO and he was keen to get started. "I look forward to working closely with Kingston Councillors, staff and the community to set a steady course for the Council term," Mr Tamlin said.

Mr Tamlin brings qualifications in science, management, banking & finance, and has worked extensively in road and infrastructure management, before moving into the local government sector. His diverse local government experience includes leading teams responsible for key community infrastructure including: the delivery of Performing Arts and Children Services centres, roads, footpaths and drains, parks and open spaces, finance, library, arts and heritage, waste, capital works, and information management. During his 10 years as CEO, South Gippsland Shire Council, Mr Tamlin:

- Transformed its financial status from relying on borrowings into a strong, financially sustainable organisation
- Secured significant state and federal funding for key local projects
- Developed a shared-services model in partnership with other regional councils
- Created a strong culture of staff retention following several years of instability
- Championed projects with regional significance such as the NBN rollout, mobile telecommunications blackspots, and Destination Gippsland tourism.

Council releases revised plan to manage and protect Kingston's Green Wedge

Kingston Council has updated its Green Wedge Management Plan to better protect our Green Wedge from inappropriate uses and encourage more open space, agricultural possibilities and recreational opportunities.

The draft plan, which will now go out for community input, identifies the values and features of our Green Wedge and the environmental and natural resources that should be protected. It also recognises the needs of the local community and makes recommendations around how the land should be used in the future.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the 2021 draft Kingston Green Wedge Management Plan is a comprehensive plan that will ensure Kingston's important Green Wedge is protected for future generations.

"Our Green Wedge Management Plan was first developed in 2012 with a 20-year action plan, but a lot has happened since then and it is time to update the plan," Cr Staikos said. "This draft plan responds to all the Green Wedge issues that exist in Kingston today, and will see it protected from uses that don't fit within our long-held vision for our Green Wedge."

"Importantly it also reinforces the council's position that the Suburban Rail Loop Authority's preferred location of the train stabling yards in Heatherton is unacceptable. Council fully intends to defend the Sandbelt Open Space - Chain of Parks Strategy, and this important core parkland, which has been earmarked for a women's regional sporting precinct."

The revised plan includes a number of other key changes to the 2012 plan, including:

- Inclusion of Council-endorsed Chain of Parks Masterplan.
- Recognising the significant progress made in closing landfill sites, and their rehabilitation.
- Embedding the proposed Purple Pipe (recycled water) project.
- The completion of the Dingley Bypass and advanced construction of Mordialloc Freeway.

- Approval of Amendment C143
 which rezoned the northern
 section of land off Kingston and
 Heatherton Roads from Special Use
 Zone Schedule 2 to Green Wedge
 A Zone to prohibit landfill and
 materials recycling.
- Recognising the approval of the Hawthorn Football Club's significant planned investment into the Green Wedge by providing for an innovative redevelopment of a former landfill site.

Our achievements include:

- Rehabilitating and opening of the 34-hectare Spring Road Reserve in Dingley Village in 2016.
- Land purchases in Clarinda and Dingley Village totalling approximately \$4 million to enhance and protect existing Chain of Parks parkland.
- The current completion of the 4-hectare Elder Street South Park at a cost of \$2 million in Clarinda.
- Working with Cleanaway on the rehabilitation and redevelopment of the Victory Road Landfill to create a 31-hectare park in Clayton South.
- Significant improvements to Heatherton Park in Clayton South, including landscaping, plantings and playground renewal.

Council calls on the Government to reduce the number of poker machines allowed in Kingston

Kingston Council has called on the Victorian Government to urgently reduce the number of electronic gaming machines allowed in the municipality. Council said a reduction in the gaming machine cap is crucial to prevent further gambling harm across the city.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the impact on the Kingston community from gambling was catastrophic with more than \$62 million lost in 2019/2020, even with gaming venues closed for 100 days due to COVID-19, and it was time to take immediate action to turn this around.

"As Councillors, we are extremely concerned about the impact of gambling harm in our community and have said enough is enough, we need to stop more pokies being allowed in Kingston," said Cr Staikos.

"Under our current cap levels, a further 268 licensed EGMs could be allowed in Kingston, this is excessive and will only lead to further harm for those families and individuals already suffering."

Council has asked the Minister for Consumer Affairs, Gaming and Liquor Regulation, Melissa Horne, to support a reduction in the Kingston EGM cap to its current level of licensed EGMs of 945.

Last year Kingston Council also joined other councils around Victoria calling on the Premier to enact urgent reforms to prevent gambling harm, including the closure of local gambling venues at midnight, until 10am.

"We know there are connections between gambling harm and mental ill-health, family violence, homelessness and other social and health issues that we care deeply about in Kingston," Cr Staikos said. "Anything that we can do to reduce gambling harm is a good thing for the whole community."

To further raise awareness of the harm gambling brings to the community, Kingston Council has engaged local playwright Kieran Carroll to write, direct and produce a play to highlight the issue. "We are seeking interested community members to be a part of a communityperformance to hopefully destigmatise the issue of gambling and gambling harm, and challenge perceptions around blame, responsibility, choice, addiction and power," said Cr Staikos.


The play will be performed at a local venue in Chelsea and at Shirley Burke Theatre later this year.

Want to Quick and Easy Way to Report a Local Issue to Council or other Authorities? Use the Snap Send Solve App

Are you aware that you can report local community issues to Council or other Authorities, using the SnapSendSolve app? Dingley residents are encouraged to download a free App to their mobile phones, which allows you to communicate any concern, large or small, to the appropriate organisation quickly, easily and efficiently.

You can report issues such as:

- · Abandoned cars or vehicles
- Abandoned trolleys
- · Animal related issues
- Communication equipment pits and lids
- · Dumped rubbish and litter
- Graffiti
- Noise
- Parking
- · Pavements and roads
- Playground equipment
- · Street lights
- Street cleaning
- Trees
- Water and sewer issues

How do you use the Snap Send Solve app?

After installing the app on your phone, to send a report you simply:

- 1. Confirm your location
- 2. Select the Incident Type
- 3. Take a photo of the issue
- 4. Fill out notes and any additional fields
- 5. Send report

For example, if you were to see a broken gate on a Dingley playground, you could open the app and take a photo of the broken gate. The location is recorded, which determines the appropriate contact person (eg. a Kingston Council officer, Vic Roads, South East Water etc). and the image is sent directly to them to be recorded and resolved.

This saves you from lengthy phone calls and emails altogether, and means that every resident can help improve our community in a practical way with a couple of clicks, solving the issue more quickly.

The Snap Send Solve app allows users to report to every Council in Australia and New Zealand as well as a number of other Authorities, including water and electricity providers, supermarket chains and State Government departments.

Pedestrian Crossings - Dingley Village Shopping Centre - Take Care

Please take care when using the pedestrian crossings at the Dingley Village shops. The pedestrian crossing road markings in the rear car park area are difficult to see, having been worn off the car park road surface. - Never assume that an approaching vehicle can see you, or will stop for you wait until all vehicles have stopped before you step off the kerb.
- Avoid crossing between parked cars or at the front or back of buses and large vehicles.



Interhealth is planning to progressively provide the COVID-19 vaccination at its clinic on Centre Dandenong Road. This is a massive undertaking and must be done carefully, in a safe and cautious manner.

COVID-19 vaccines are being made available to people in phases, with those most at risk receiving their vaccinations first. To find out if you are eligible to receive the vaccine now, visit https://covid-vaccine.healthdirect.gov.au/eligibility and complete the COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Checker.

Booking your appointment

COVID-19 vaccinations are voluntary and free.

COVID-19 vaccination booking is now available ONLINE, via the HOTDOC app or via our website.

Please try to avoid making COVID-19 vaccine appointments directly with our friendly reception staff unless absolutely necessary.

If you are not a regular patient of our clinic and would like to see a doctor to discuss COVID-19 vaccination or other issues, please access our normal system and book an appointment.

Preparing for your vaccination

Please bring your Medicare Card with you on the day of your vaccination. Please familiarise yourself with the Preparation for Vaccination document. This will explain mandatory government eligibility and consent information. You will need to bring proof of eligibility in the form of identification or documentation stating your occupation or health record by your doctor. You may not receive the vaccine if you do not have this. All vaccines given will be recorded into the Australian Immunisation Registry (AIR).



If you have questions or concerns about the COVID-19 vaccine, please make a regular appointment with your doctor to discuss your options and next steps. If you have cold or flu type symptoms, please cancel your appointment for the COVID-19 vaccine and arrange a regular (telehealth) consultation with your doctor.

Influenza Vaccination

We have a supply of Government funded Influenza Vaccines for patients 65 years and over and those patients with an accepted chronic disease. Private influenza vaccines are also available. Please note that a 2-week separation is required between Flu and any COVID-19 vaccine appointments. These can be received in any order but not given at the same time.

Retire at 65 but don't retire your money

Australian retirees are facing a 'double whammy' when it comes to funding their retirement. On the one hand we, as a nation, are enjoying longer and healthier lives. On the other hand, record low interest rates have slashed the returns on the traditional bedrocks of post-retirement investment portfolios such as term deposits, cash management accounts and annuities.

A dilemma

This is the dilemma facing Dave and Linda. On the point of retirement these fit and active 65 year olds are looking forward to regular overseas travel while maintaining their comfortable lifestyle. They estimate this will cost them \$80,000 per year, to be funded from their combined retirement savings of \$1 million. Both are in good health, and realise there's a high likelihood that one or both of them could live well into their gos.

Naturally, Dave and Linda's first thought is about security and capital preservation. This leads them to look at investing their funds in a portfolio mainly comprising income-producing investments that will spare them from the volatility of share and property markets.

However they quickly discover that, with interest rates so low, it will be difficult to achieve a return of just 3% per annum. A simple financial calculation shows that if they draw \$80,000 each year from a portfolio with this low rate of return, the money will run out in just under 16 years. This strategy will see them barely make it into their 80s.

Time for a rethink

This highlights to Dave and Linda that longevity risk is as much of a threat as investment risk. To address the risk of outliving their money, Dave and Linda consider a portfolio that, while retaining some conservative investments, apportions most of their funds to a well-diversified range of growth assets including property, Australian and international shares, and some higher-yielding income funds.

With an estimated return of 7% p.a., Dave and Linda's money is calculated to last just over 30 years, seeing them well into their gos.

Balancing the risks

Yes, a growth portfolio is, from an investment point of view, higher risk than a defensive or conservative portfolio.

That is, it will be more volatile, rising and falling in value along with investment markets. Dave and Linda will need to accept this volatility if they want to meet their lifestyle goals. However, even 10 years is a long investment horizon, let alone 30, so with time on their side they should be able to ride out any market downturns.

And there's another safety net. The above calculations ignore any age pension. As Dave and Linda draw down on their savings they will probably qualify for some age pension.

Not only will this offset some of the investment risk, it will substantially extend the date when their savings will eventually be exhausted.

Helpful advice

Establishing a well diversified, considered portfolio is a little more complex than setting up a conservative portfolio. It will also require more active monitoring and regular review.

On top of that individual circumstances can change quickly, particularly in older age.

FRIENDS OF BRAESIDE PARK

Recently, I streamed a meeting of a neighbouring Melbourne council and saw one of their councillors challenge another for constantly 'babbling on about climate change' and the need for a new local law to protect large canopy trees to reduce the Urban Heat effect.

He triumphantly pointed to the past weekend's freezing, gusty, hailing, stormy weather as one of the coldest on record for April! That Councillor either doesn't know the difference between weather and climate, or simply wanted to undermine the introduction of a local law to save large trees to protect the vulnerable in the community.

You would think that with both a climate and an extinction crisis in full swing, and a global pandemic overshadowing all our lives, that listening to science and protecting our community and nature might be important.

However, this councillor's attitude is another reason why Australia leads the world on the extinction of mammals and is fourth globally for the extinction of all species. Many people hope that ignoring it is the best way of denying global heating (which increases erratic stormy weather here, and cyclones further north). Others, simply do not understand or do not want to, for greed, laziness, or fear?

I have spent twenty-five years living here, observing the urbanisation of Dingley Village and the ever-shrinking Green Wedge - the Mordialloc Freeway is only the latest and most obvious thing. It all makes me shudder as to what future generations will think of us.

Major Roads Project Victoria recently communicated what will be planted beside Braeside Park along their Freeway, and especially near the underpass into the Park. The plants on their list were not local species indigenous to the area. This is River Red Gum country and there were none. There were no native grasses - just cooch, turf grass. In between, there are Coastal and Manna Gums, Narrow Leaved Peppermint Gums, Blackwoods, Drooping Sheoak, Black-anther Lily, Smooth Flax Lily, Cushion Bush, and Spiny Saltbush.

So, any hope that the freeway's destruction of biodiversity will be 'mitigated' by native vegetation is a token. A recent visit to the Little Desert National Park, brought home to me once again, the mess we have made of our country. Little Desert NP has an incredibly rich biodiversity adapted to the arid conditions. The wheat fields surrounding are monocultural wastelands which produce wheat for export.

The farmers are under immense pressure to grow their farms, more efficiently by clearing more Mallee scrub (note the derogatory term to describe a perfectly adapted flora) by working the land more intensively, tapping into the rapidly diminishing Wimmera River and groundwater and hoping for more drought resistant species to be developed.

The question is actually whether crops should be grown in such marginal areas. Sir David Attenborough, in his recent documentary 'Extinction' called for action to rewild the world. In the case of the Mallee and inland deserts of Australia, this could mean reducing the farmed areas to expand bushland to protect our precious water and soil. Here in Dingley Village,

that could mean reducing the impact of urbanisation by rewilding our gardens and nature strips with indigenous plants, and directing stormwater into miniature wetlands and swales. It could mean addressing tree cover inequality across our suburb, and simply planting trees and more greenery on own land to ensure that everyone is more resilient to the mental pressures of urban living and its hazards of heat waves.

It could mean using programmes such as Gardening for Wildlife and Nature Stewards. (The former is already available through the Kingston Council. The latter is a relatively new Victorian program that invites and supports adults to learn, connect, and act for nature locally.

It aims to grow Victoria's 'rewilding force' of volunteers who give their time for nature. It builds participants' ecological knowledge and connections). Program? To date nearly three billion children have been vaccinated with the sabin vaccine.

Our own members have raised funds for this program and also administered sabin on the ground in developing countries. During the first half of the 20th century, polio crippled over half a million people, mainly children, every year.

Even today, children in some developing countries continue to fall victim to the disease. Through Rotary's efforts, we have reduced the number of polio cases by more than 99.9 percent and have reduced the number of endemic countries from 122 to 2. Worldwide Rotarians have contributed US\$2.1 billion to polio eradication and we hope that soon like smallpox, polio will be completely eliminated.

We also hope that the worldwide COVID-19 vaccination program has the same result as this also impacts our ability to administer sabin in developing countries.


