Vale Phil Kent, Inaugural Editor, Dingley Dossier

Phillip Kent passed away in April of this year and we extend our sympathies to the Kent family.



It was in 1972 that members of the Dingley Village Community Association met and decided to publish a local newspaper to inform residents of events, they included Phillip Kent, Murray Cowell and Brian Pullen. Phil was appointed the editor and produced a broadsheet called Dingley Doings, which evolved into the Dingley Dossier and published 91 issues over 11 years, until 1983 before handing over to Ron & Marj Vogt. Phil's words were – "the Dossier was born out of a necessity for development, growth, innovation and accomplishment."

Phil and Kath Kent (Garside) were married in 1955 and lived in Forest Park Rd. Their life revolved around the Church, the golf club and the tennis club. His earliest impression of Dingley was – a quaint little village with a church, school, general store and golf course surrounded by market gardens. Very much a reminder of villages in England. Many of us in Dingley, remember the great contribution Phil made to the Village.

Moorabbin Airport Masterplan 2021 REJECTED

The Federal Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development, Barnaby Joyce has rejected the draft Masterplan 2021-2041 for Moorabbin Airport (Moorabbin Airport is not subject to the Victorian Planning Policy or Kingston Planning Scheme).

The draft plan sought to:

- develop the remaining 44 hectares of undeveloped airport land for non-aviation commercial activity.
- increase aviation students from 1350 to 1800 students per year (safe capacity limit).
- increase aviation movements from 268,000 per year to 375,000 (the practical capacity limit) by 2041, with flight training operations accounting for 90% of movements.

Both Kingston Council and the Aviation Industry have welcomed the plan's rejection, due to concerns about:

- reduction of land available for aviation use
- safety risks and adequacy of space around runways
- commercial development near neighbouring homes

The rejected plan also failed to address the issue of aircraft noise or any measures to reduce circuit training activity on surrounding residential areas.

So now it is back to the drawing board for the Moorabbin Airport Corporation (MAC) to produce a revised airport plan.

With the majority of circuit training flying to the east of the Airport (over Dingley Village), DVCA is very concerned about an increase of 33% in aviation students, and their circuit training flight activity and will work hard to have circuit training aircraft noise issues recognised and addressed by MAC in any revised plan.

Green Wedge Good News - Metro Concrete VCAT Decision P569

DVCA is pleased to see that Metro Concrete's request for a permit extension to 5 December 2033, has been rejected by VCAT. This VCAT decision, supports Council's refusal to grant a permit extension on this site, as the site's zoning, Green Wedge - Zone A, now prohibits concrete batching operations.

Metro Concrete, located at 683 - 687 Clayton Road Clarinda, is directly opposite the closed landfill site in Victory Road, currently being rehabilitated as a 31 hectare public park, which will be part of the Kingston Sandbelt Chain of Parks project, to provide linked parks from Karkarook Park through to Braeside Park.

It is great to see VCAT upholding Planning Policy for the Sandbelt Open Space Project, with their determination stating:

"I am not persuaded that the continued use of the land for the purposes of a concrete batching plant for a further eleven years would make a positive contribution to the achievement of a linked network of public open spaces, nor does it amount to a well-designed development which is compatible with the Sandbelt open space project by offering recreational or tourism related opportunities on a site that has high exposure to planned open spaces."

DVCA thanks Kingston Council for their recent media release calling for changes to the proposed redevelopment of Kingswood Golf Course. Our Council and State and Federal Politicians have all supported our fight against Kingswood's development.

completed their report for the Minister of Planning. We trust that the Victorian Planning Minister, who will make the final decision, is listening to our community's massive rejection of this proposed rezoning and development for Kingswood Golf Course, in the heart of our village.

Kingston welcomes refusal of airport masterplan

The future of aviation at Moorabbin Airport looks more secure thanks to the Australian Government's refusal of plans that would have put the local aviation industry at risk.

Kingston Council welcomes today's announcement from Deputy Prime Minister Barnaby Joyce - who is also the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development - that the draft Moorabbin Airport masterplan has been refused under the Commonwealth Airports Act.

Moorabbin Airport is regularly listed as the second busiest airport in Australia, and plays an important industry role, training approximately 29% of Australia's pilots.

Moorabbin also provides critical links to Tasmania, King Island, rural and regional NSW, and SA.

The airport site is leased to the Moorabbin Airport Corporation (MAC) by the Commonwealth Government, and the Airports Act requires it be maintained for aviation purposes. But Kingston Mayor Cr Steve Staikos said the draft masterplan proposed by MAC continued the trend of previous masterplans that facilitated substantial non-aviation development, further threatening to squeeze out aviation businesses.

Kingston Council and local aviation representatives have been advocating to the Australian Government over many months to refuse the draft plan due to concerns including:

- Significant safety risks posed by commercial buildings being built close to airport runways.
- Allowing large-scale factories to be built metres from adjoining established homes.
- Reduced land for aviation purposes compromising the medium to longer term intent of the land for aviation
- Inability to provide surety of tenure for aviation businesses whose survival is reliant on existing on the airport site.

"We welcome the Australian Government's refusal of the proposed masterplan and believe it sends a clear signal in support of the local aviation industry," Cr Staikos said.

"We want to see adequate space set aside around runways to ensure safety and secure a strong future for aviation businesses, plus see much tighter controls to limit commercial development near neighbouring homes. "We believe the decision at Moorabbin Airport is an important one for Local Governments around Australia who have a strong role to play in enhancing aviation policy."

Kingston's Chicquita Ward Councillor Tracey Davies said Council and the Moorabbin Chamber of Commerce were pleased their concerns were directly heard by the Deputy Prime Minister and Senator Susan McDonald through the Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport Senate hearing, which is examining Australia's general aviation industry.

The support of the Member for Isaacs, Hon Mark Dreyfus QC MP has also been critical to reinforce that much work is still to be done to deliver the benefits intended through airport deregulation.

"We were proud to also work with the Moorabbin Airport Chamber of Commerce and Industry and I would like to particularly acknowledge the support provided by Adrianne Fleming OAM of Tristar Aviation, to raise important safety issues and support our local business community," Cr Davies said.

"We now look forward to working with MAC, the Moorabbin Airport Chamber of Commerce and the Australian Government to develop an enhanced plan that meets the needs of the aviation industry and neighbouring residents."

State Government investment needed in Patterson River

Kingston Council has called on the Victorian Government to invest in the future of the Patterson River Precinct.

There are significant issues that require attention at Patterson River (and Mordialloc Creek), which the Department of Environment, Land, Water and

Planning (DELWP) have identified as requiring \$60 million over four years to address.

Land management responsibilities are complicated along the river, with Melbourne Water owning the land, which is managed by DELWP, and maintained by Parks Victoria, but Council continues to work with all these parties to protect these important areas.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said while it was encouraging to see funding go to the DELWP to deliver a masterplan for Patterson River, the process mustn't delay actions that are needed presently.

"We are concerned that the state government wants all future funding bids to be guided by the masterplan, which means that immediate and urgent actions would need to wait until the process is completed despite current funds not nearly meeting the current maintenance needs of the precinct," Cr Staikos said.

Banksia Ward Councillor Cameron Howe said there were some clear problems that need addressing immediately.

"Patterson River is home to the state's busiest boat ramp, with pedestrian and maritime maintenance issues unaddressed for too many years, including steep street to trail access points, unstable walkways cordoned off and malfunctioning lighting through to ageing boat ramps," Cr Howe said.

"The masterplan, when funded, will upgrade this critical gateway to the bay, but adequate maintenance funding from the state is imperative now, especially with user falls and incidents at some of the street to trail access points and growing boating user complaints."



MARCUS CLARKE LIBRARY

Petition for Dingley Village Library Name Change to The Marcus Clarke Library

Will you help us to honour a great Victorian, writer and journalist?

Have you ever wondered the reason for the naming of Marcus Road in Dingley Village? It was named after one of our most celebrated authors and writers in late 19th Century Victoria, Marcus Clarke.

Marcus Clarke spent time in Dingley in the 1870s while he wrote his most famous novel "For the Term of His Natural Life". He was also famous as a journalist and writer while working for the Argus by representing the reality of how the poor lived in the slums of Melbourne at that time.

Accomplished writer Martin Flanagan advised us that "For the Term of his Natural Life" opened the eyes of the English and colonials to the savage treatment of convicts. He spent time at Port Arthur before it was closed down. It was to Australia what Uncle Tom's Cabin was to the US in its treatment of slaves.

Clarke's contribution to Australian literature has been recognized with a number of place names. A main street in Canberra City bears his name. Marcus Road and Clarke Road commemorate his time in Dingley Village.

In 1973 he was honoured on a postage stamp bearing his portrait issued by Australia Post and he is one of the writers commemorated with a plaque on the Sydney Writers Walk.

It's time we locals did the same. He was inducted into The Australian Media Hall of Fame in 2017 with the following tributes: Clarke - journalist, poet, bon vivant and novelist was described by his biographer as the only truly monumental work of literature in the first 100 years of Australian history, and a book that has never been out of print.

The novel was inspired by Clarke's reporting on the convict prison system in Tasmania. Clarke also wrote a witty, irreverent column in The Argus and has a collection of short stories called Australian Tales based on his time in the bush and country towns

Noted Australian writer, Martin Flanagan, has had this to say of Marcus Clarke.

Marcus Clarke, dead at 35, was a prodigy.

"He is chiefly remembered for his novel, For the Term of His Natural Life, which did roughly for the convict system in the Australian colonies what Uncle Tom's Cabin did for the institution of slavery in the United States – it confronted the middle and upper classes with the gross inhumanity practised by their own societies.

For the Term of His Natural Life travelled the world and, in a speech in Melbourne in 1895, 14 years after Clarke's death, Mark Twain declared him a "genius" and said: "I may tell you that we think a deal more of Marcus Clarke in our country than I am sorry to think you do here."

We now have a beautiful new Library, fittingly enough on Marcus Road, and members of the Dingley Village Writers Group consider that it would be highly appropriate if the Library could be named in his honour to recognise his significant contribution to Australian journalism and literature.

We would appreciate your support - evidence of community support to substantiate our application to Kingston Council that we can have a Marcus Clarke Memorial Library.

Marcus was a settler in our region, like many other less celebrated but hard-working people, who crafted the fields for vegetables and fruits to feed early Melbourne. Like others, his efforts in another century helped to set the basis for the fortunate lives that we live today.

If you told me twelve months ago that I would be running for the State election this year, I would have laughed. Having been in business all my life, I never had the inclination to enter

That said, over the last two years, the lack of a transparent process from the State Government during the COVID pandemic and the world record lockdowns drove me to consider standing against the Andrews Government, which ultimately led me to stand for the State seat of Clarinda for the Liberal Party. Since endorsement, I have connected with the community to discuss local issues within Clarinda (Dingley, Heatherton, Clarinda, Moorabbin and parts of Mentone &

Clayton). It is clear that this same lack of transparent process and lack of community consultation extends to the issues in Clarinda, including the Suburban Rail Loop across the South-East, the Train Marshalling Yards slated to be built on protected green wedge space in Heatherton, the Level Crossing Removals in Parkdale and of course the decision to over-ride the Kingston Councils' ruling to reject the plans by Australian Super to build more than 800 units on the Kingswood Golf Course.

The Kingswood Golf Course itself is obviously close to the heart of the Dingley community. This over development does not fit within the area, will add to traffic and infrastructure congestion, will impact green space, wildlife and may also increase the risk of flooding.

I am not against development but it needs to be balanced against infrastructure needs of the community such as schooling, roads and sporting facilities. It needs to fit within the existing local area and it needs to be done in a transparent way with consultation and input from local residents. As it stands, this is not the case. Everything I have raised may benefit people that are outside of Dingley, Heatherton and Clarinda through their super returns or train access BUT there is not the same pay back to local residents of Clarinda. This is just not fair.

Win, lose or draw at the next State election, I will focus my time fighting for the local residents of Clarinda interests and rights. And if elected, I will then have the platform to continue the battle. The Kingswood Golf Course development will be one of these, along with moving the Train Stabling Yards, investment in recreational and sporting facilities, support for small business and achieving better outcomes from infrastructure investment.

Des Lucas, Ranger Team Leader, Sandbelt Parklands, and long-time Braeside Park Ranger Digger are retiring. Rangers, Andrew and Kelly, departed a couple of months previously. Yes that's right the full quota of Braeside Park Rangers has either transferred or retire by May, 2022.

Des and Digger have been at Braeside Park for over thirty years each and their replacements will have big boots to fill. As Parks Victoria Rangers, they have actively organised and supported the Friends' Group to transform Braeside Park from a Metropolitan Sewerage Farm into today's unique indigenous park. Arriving in the 1990s, Digger as the name suggests helped build the Visitors' Centre, the wetland and nest boxes, and create trails throughout the Park. Des, always enthusiastic supporter of The Friends' volunteers, encouraged the

procuring of grants to start the Community Indigenous Nursery which propagated thousands of plants to transform the sewerage farm into today's Park.

Des inspired and lead the Friends' community planting days, guided tours, nocturnal walks, bird, frog, rabbit and insect surveys and attended after work hours' Committee Meeting.

Food Allergies

Food Allergy Week, (22–28 May), aims to raise awareness of food allergy including potentially fatal food allergies. Australia has one of the highest incidences of food allergy in the world and this is increasing at an alarming rate.

With no known cure for food allergy, awareness and education are most important, as an allergic reaction can quickly become life threatening. A severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) must be treated as a medical emergency.

It's important for Australians to be aware of food allergies, know the signs and symptoms of an allergic reaction and know how to respond in an emergency.

What is a food allergy?

Food allergy is an immune system reaction that occurs soon after eating a certain food. Even a tiny amount of the allergy-causing food can trigger signs and symptoms in some people, a food allergy can cause severe symptoms or even a lifethreatening reaction known as anaphylaxis.

Signs and Symptoms

The most common food allergy signs and symptoms include:

- · Tingling or itching in the mouth
- · Hives, itching or eczema
- Swelling of the lips, face, tongue and throat or other parts of the body
- · Wheezing, nasal congestion or trouble breathing
- Abdominal pain, diarrhea, nausea or vomiting
- Dizziness, light-headedness or fainting

Anaphylaxis

Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life threatening. It must be treated as a medical emergency, requiring immediate treatment and urgent medical attention.

- Constriction and tightening of the airways
- A swollen throat or the sensation of a lump in your throat that makes it difficult to breathe
- · Shock with a severe drop in blood pressure
- Rapid pulse
- Dizziness, light-headedness or loss of consciousnes







- With one in 10 children developing an allergy before their first birthday, Australia has one of the highest rates of food allergies in the world.
- For many, managing severe allergies doesn't stop when you grow up. Individuals in their teens and 20's are at the greatest risk of an allergic reaction.
- Over half a million Aussies have a diagnosed food allergy and research shows this number is growing.
- Whilst 90% of food allergic reactions are caused by 10 foods, there are more than 170 foods known to be triggers. Bananas, kiwi fruit, mustard and celery just to name a few!
- Do you know the signs and symptoms of an allergic reaction? It's surprising how many Aussies don't.
- We've all been guilty of a self-diagnosis on the Internet. But if you suspect you have a food allergy, it's important to consult your general practitioner (GP).
- Do you have a family or friend with a food allergy?
 Make sure you know when and how to administer their adrenaline (epinephrine) autoinjector.
- Be careful, not fearful. Allergies can be life threatening but there are a number of strategies you can put in place to help reduce the risk of a reaction. Learn how to manage your allergy.




