Congratulations Simone Hardham for being named Westfield Southlands local hero for 2022 and receiving a grant of \$20,000 for your organisation Mindful Makings.

Village Dingley resident Simone Hardham has developed a novel way to help local people struggling with mental illness or seclusion.

In addition to a demanding full-time role with Emergency Management Victoria and Department of Health, Simone is the founder of the non-profit Mindful Makings. This local volunteerrun initiative combines the benefits of mindfulness with enjoyable creative

workshops led by experts in different crafts. Driven by the motto of Create, Connect, Be Present, Simone helps maintain positive mental health while experiencing community connection.

Although Simone launched Mindful Makings just before the start of the COVID pandemic, she has made a go of it. So far, the non-profit has held faceto-face workshops for more than 200 people from various local government

The workshops are small and personal, with participants able to choose from activities including drawing, woodwork,


painting, writing, gardening or macramé.

Simone has been a committed supporter of mental health charities since 2014 when her father passed away from suicide. She was named 2021 Kingston Woman of the Year in recognition of her volunteering efforts for mental health and community service.

"We have been able to create an environment where participants can put aside their mental and physical health concerns," Simone says.

Mindful Makings will put the grant launching much-needed towards mindfulness programs for men and teens.

The Blue Line

With the last of Victoria Police's Covid-19 responsibilities now complete, Chief Commissioner Shane Patton's back-to-basics initiative will see police focus on the issues that matter most too local communities.

Victoria Police's new neighbourhood policing approach is now in place state wide having been piloted in eight areas last year.

It sees police compile a register of issues concerning the local community so they can task officers to specifically address them and report back to residents on what has been done. Police work with partners like local councils, community groups and government agencies when issues are more complex.

It is also embarking on a major effort to hear Victorian's perceptions of safety, with a survey in every police service area. It will additionally gauge the ways people want to engage with police and how comfortable they feel approaching PSOs and police.

Kingswood Regional Sporting Centre/SRL Delta Site Replacement Proposal

The Bad News

The recent Suburban Rail Loop (SRL) Environment Effects Assessment (EES) has determined that the SRL train stabling yard be located on the Heatherton Delta 34 hectare site.

The Good News

Equivalent replacement open space will be provided for the community, as stated in the Minister's SRL EES.

"I acknowledge that the introduction of the stabling facility in the location proposed will cause significant changes to the current amenity of the surrounding area and will alter long held plans for the broader regional open space strategy of the Chain of Parks, p.iv

A key adverse impact of the stabling facility is the loss of the significant public open space that was planned for the site, as part of the Chain of Parks. It is notable that the site is quite large and would have been capable of providing for regional active open space... It is also a very significant adverse impact of the project. p.13

To offset this key impact, the IAC concluded that a replacement area of open space needs to be identified and a process for its acquisition implemented. p.13

I have turned my mind to how best to achieve early delivery of quality open space that will have tangible benefits to the local community, in order to meaningfully offset the loss of the planned open space on the Delta landfill. p.14

It will be important that the Kingston City Council and the community's views are heard and considered, in the identification of the proposed offsetting solution. I also expect that the delivery of the replacement open space will occur as soon as possible with the intention to establish it prior to operation of the stabling facility. p 14"

Minister's Assessment Under Environment Effects Act 1978 July 2022, HON LILY D'AMBROSIO MP Minister for Environment and Climate Action, 5 August 2022

Kingston Council's recent media release (22 August 2022) has called for the urgent provision of a "fit for purpose replacement for the 34 hectares of planned regional sporting facilities which will be lost to the train stabling".

In response to these developments, DVCA has formally requested Council propose to Government the 54 hectare former Kingswood Golf Course as the preferred replacement site for Regional Sporting Facility. This request has been made by the DVCA, as the acquisition of the Kingswood Golf Course site by government for such

an environment-friendly and community-friendly purpose would also:

- Ensure the regional sporting facility is still local (Kingswood is <4km from the Heatherton site).
- Enable compensation to Australian Super for their thus-far failed purchase.
- Fulfil the consideration of site acquisition as advised by Step 1 of the Golf course Redevelopment Standing Advisory Committee's Guidelines.
- Be consistent with Government's 2018
 election promises and commitments
 to the Chain of Parks provision and
 adjacent Green Wedge area.
- Be advantageous to Government's image in the newly redistributed Seat of Clarinda, effected already by the SRL, Skyrail and Alex Fraser decisions.

We would hope this decision can be reached before the state election in November and while Kingswood is still green, healthy and zoned appropriately.

Our new Pavilion looks great and includes female-friendly change rooms, disability access, umpire's facilities and a community room for our use.

DVCA members, Shirley DeWever and Jon Garrard, have worked hard to get the best possible outcomes in Council's community consultation process for the Chadwick Reserve's redevelopment.

Spring Road Cycle/Walking Path Improvement

DVCA was pleased to see Council improving the useability of the Spring Rd cycle/walking path. Their recent upgrade of the path interchange at the blind end of Spring Road, outside Archibald's honey factory will make cycling and walking on this path much safer and easier to use - all helping to encourage cycle/walking in our village.



Nominations open for Kingston Women of the Year Awards

Nominations are now open for our annual Kingston Women of the Year Awards that celebrate the outstanding contribution that women in Kingston make to community, society and industry.

Do you know a woman who is a leader in their field, who inspires others or who has made a significant difference to our community through their exceptional professional or personal achievements? Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the annual Awards, launched in 2019, are all about celebrating those women who are making an outstanding and positive difference in our community.

Site for regional sporting facility must be urgently secured

Kingston Council has called for a new site for a regional sporting facility to be urgently secured in Kingston's Green Wedge to replace the Delta site which will now be used for the Suburban Rail Loop (SRL). Acting Mayor Jenna Davey-Burns said the Victorian Government must secure a new site as the highest priority to meet booming demand for sporting facilities in the region. "For years, our community had been looking forward to extensive sporting facilities being delivered on the Delta Site in Kingston's Green Wedge," Cr Davey-Burns said.

"We need an urgent solution to provide much needed female-friendly and regional sporting facilities to meet growing demand."

Kingston Council welcomed the fact that the Suburban Rail Loop East Inquiry and Advisory Committee (IAC) report committed to providing replacement open space for the regional sporting facility. For several years, Kingston Council has been working with key sporting bodies to identify much-needed facilities.

"The 34-hectare Delta site would have met existing needs, however further space is also needed to serve the increased population the SRL is expected to generate," Cr Davey-Burns said. "It's clear that the new sporting facility must be very large-scale to address a wide range of sporting needs, including football, cricket, soccer, hockey, baseball, cycling and more."

Following an urgent Special Council meeting responding to the recent Victorian Government SRL announcement, Kingston will now be advocating for a replacement site to be secured in Kingston's Green Wedge to ensure the regional sporting facility progresses as a matter of highest priority.

"Now that the outcomes of the Environmental Effects Statement are clear we expect this to be the highest of priorities for the State Government," Cr Davey-Burns said. Karkarook Ward Councillor Hadi Saab said the Heatherton and Clarinda

communities were deeply disappointed in the Victorian Government decision to proceed with the train stabling yard at the Delta site. "Addressing our community's disappointment requires a concerted effort by the State Government to deliver on a long promised open space commitment," Cr Saab said.

"I have heard community feedback that if the stabling yard does proceed, despite strong objections from Council and the community, and the IAC findings, the replacement site must at the very least meet community expectations."

Council appreciates that the Delta site was uniquely positioned to strategically service the growing needs for female-friendly sports and the need for additional sporting facilities, as well as being a core connection to the Chain of Parks.

To address the loss of this opportunity, the replacement site must (at a minimum) be:

- Equivalent or greater in size and not fragmented.
- Located nearby and well-serviced by public transport.
- Able to accommodate required sporting fields and buildings.
- Promptly acquired and early offset opportunities actioned.
- Located so as not to displace key Green Wedge activities, such as agriculture.

"The Government should also prioritise finding real solutions for neighbouring residents who were promised open space over their back fences and instead will face years of construction and a future stabling facility," Cr Saab said.

Dingley Village Residents, the \$25 million dollar bonus will not be paid to the Peninsula Kingswood Golf Course in Frankston. We wonder what the outcome would have been if AustralianSuper had talked to Residents and Council, instead of fighting us.

The question that is most asked about Kingswood - our Central Park - is: When will we know if re-zoning and development is approved by the Victorian Government Planning Minister? We simply don't know. Kingston council abandoned (rejected) three plans and that should have been the end of it.

The Committee report has been on the three consecutive Planning Minister's desk since March, but still we wait. We can only assume its become a political football, with a reasonably acceptable announcement to be made just before the Election, to favour their candidate, or its a dreadful decision, so it will be left until after the Election, to ensure their candidate is not affected by a negative announcement.

MEDICAL MATTERS

Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is a disease where cells in the breast grow abnormally and in an uncontrolled way to form a lump, known as a tumour.

If left untreated, lumps may spread from breast tissue to other parts of the body, such as the bones, liver or lungs. Breast cancer affects both men and women, although it is less common in men.

Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in women, and it's estimated that 8 Australians die from the disease each day. Thankfully, with prompt detection and treatment, 9 in 10 women with breast cancer survive at least 5 years, and many live much longer.

Symptoms of breast cancer can include:

- A lump or area of thickened tissue in the breast (especially if only on one side)
- A change in the size or shape of one or both breasts.
- A change in the shape or appearance of the nipple, such as crusting, sores, redness or inversion (where the nipple turns in instead of pointing out).
- Changes to the skin of the breasts, such as dimpling (looking like an orange peel), rash, or redness
- Discomfort or swelling in either armpit.

Symptoms of breast cancer in men are similar to those that women experience. BreastScreen Australia offers a free screening program for women at risk of breast cancer:

- If you're aged between 50 and 74 years, you'll be invited to access a free mammograms every 2 years. This is because nearly 4 in 5 breast cancers occur in women aged over 50.
- If you're aged between 40 and 49 years or over 75 years, you are also eligible but won't be contacted about it.
- Women under 40 years of age are usually not offered breast screening because the density of their breast tissue makes it harder to detect cancers on mammograms.

Younger women with a strong family history of breast or ovarian cancer, or women with breast cancer diagnosed in the last 5 years may also benefit from breast screening. For more details, call BreastScreen Australia on 13 20 50 or visit their website.

Opportunities To Buy

There are multiple rules and eligibility requirements for the FHBG. It is important to note the scheme is not available to assist you at most banks.

Prospective first home buyers need to speak to their broker to be aware of what is required to enable home ownership. Financial strategy in property purchase can be complicated and is different for every individual in a different situation. Quality advice is paramount.

On a general commentary level, real estate agencies are reporting increased 'days on market' for all price range properties. This is a reflection of the decreased buyer competition and is creating potential opportunity for buyers at all price points. 

Australia has some of the highest levels of UV radiation in the world – in fact, UV radiation is strong enough to cause sunburn in as little as 11 minutes on a summer's day. Additionally, during summer, the Earth's orbit brings Australia closer to the sun (as compared to Europe during its summer), resulting in an additional 7% UV intensity.

Coupled with our clearer atmospheric conditions, this means that Australians are exposed to up to 15% more UV than Europeans. This explains my observations while in Europe. Leading into spring and summer, I thought it would be useful to remind everyone about the damage UV exposure can have on your eyes. The main source of UV radiation is of course via the sun, yet the cumulative effects in terms of health are becoming more apparent with an increased life expectancy and depleting

ozone layer. UV exposure to the skin surrounding the eye can lead to non-melanoma related cancers of the eyelids and surrounding structures.

Not only are these forms of cancer highly damaging to the structure of the eye, but also life threatening. Cataracts have a very strong correlation with UV exposure, especially those that occur at the front of the ocular lens. This can lead to reduced vision and increased glare. A Pterygium is a growth also with a strong correlation with UV radiation, it has been described as "surfers' eye" by some. This is a growth on the front of the white portion of the eye. It can block vision if it becomes advanced and must be removed surgically. With the back of the eye, shorter wavelengths of light and UV radiation can increase the risk of Macular Degeneration- affecting your central vision and is one of the leading causes of blindness in Australia.

Given the risks of ocular pathology, as optometrists, we always recommended UV protection for your eyes. The obvious solution of course, is to wear sunglasses. Surprisingly, most contact lenses and clear spectacle lenses especially with an anti-reflective coating also provide a significant degree of UV protection. 




